SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT STUDY OF TWO POTENTIAL DEDICATED SOURCES OF FUNDING FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION.

WHEREAS, public education is a critical pillar of a 1 productive and equitable society; and 2 3 WHEREAS, article X, section 1, of the Hawaii State 4 5 Constitution requires the State to provide a system of public education; and 6 7 WHEREAS, funding for public education in Hawaii is 8 primarily sourced from the State's general fund; and 9 10 WHEREAS, public education in Hawaii is not adequately 11 funded; and 12 13 WHEREAS, chronic underfunding of public schools undermines 14 the State's goal of providing a quality education to all 15 children in the State; and 16 17 WHEREAS, it is necessary to develop a durable, dedicated 18 source of funding the State's public education system, to ensure 19 that the State will be able to prepare children to meet the 20 social and economic demands of the future; and 21 22 WHEREAS, one option for a dedicated source of funding 23 24 public education in the State is a state lottery; and 25 26 WHEREAS, a second option for a dedicated source of funding 27 public education in the State is a one per cent allocation of county real property tax revenues; now, therefore, 28 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 31

House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislative
 Reference Bureau is requested to study and determine the
 potential yield of a state lottery as a dedicated source of
 funding for the State's public education system; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 7 Bureau is requested to study and determine the potential yield 8 of a one per cent allocation of county real property tax 9 revenues as a dedicated source of funding for the State's public 10 education system; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Legislative
Reference Bureau and Department of Education.
