SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE AND PUBLISH INFORMATION RELATED TO FEDERAL IMPACT AID.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Defense is not 1 meeting its financial obligations to Hawaii's public schools; 2 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 3 of United States Public Law 81-874, the Department of Defense is required to pay impact aid 6 to the State to offset the financial burden on the State's 7 public education system of non-taxable military lands and non-8 payment of income and general excise tax by military personnel; 9 10 and 11 12 WHEREAS, according to the Department of Education, however, in fiscal year 2019, the federal impact aid reimbursement paid 13 to the State was only 12.91 percent of the total per-pupil cost 14 of educating eleven thousand to fourteen thousand military 15 16 students; and 17 18 WHEREAS, when reimbursing tuition for federally connected 19 students attending approved overseas schools, the Department of 20 Defense Education Activity office calculates reimbursement rates using the "full cost recovery method", in compliance with 21 22 Government Accountability Office guidelines; and 23 WHEREAS, applying this same methodology of full cost 24 recovery to military students in Hawaii, the Department of 25 Defense owes the State approximately \$170,687,000 to 26 \$217,238,000 for fiscal year 2019 alone; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, state income tax and general excise tax are the primary sources of funding for the Department of Education; and 30 31 WHEREAS, when Department of Defense families utilize the 32 State's public education system without paying full, or any, 33 income or excise taxes, and the Department of Defense does not 34 fully reimburse the State for these students' educational costs, 35



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1 Hawaii residents and taxpayers effectively, and unfairly, substantially subsidize the military students' education; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, over time, this amounts to several billion dollars 5 owed by the Department of Defense to the State for costs borne by Hawaii's residents; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, an annual report to the Legislature and the public 9 is thus needed to hold the Department of Defense accountable for moneys owed; now, therefore, 10 11 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 13 14 that the Department of Education is requested, no later than 15 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023 and no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 16 each Regular Session thereafter, to report to the Legislature 17 and publish on the department's website a summary of the federal 18 19 impact aid owed and paid by the United States Department of 20 Defense pursuant to section 3 of United States Public Law 81-874; and 21 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to include the following in its annual reports and 24 25 online publications: 26 The total number of federally connected and military (1)27 students attending Department of Education schools and 28 29 the per-pupil cost of the students' education; 30 (2) The full cost recovery method calculation for federal 31 32 impact aid reimbursement owed for the year, in compliance with Government Accountability Office 33 quidelines; 34 35 (3) The basic support payment calculation for federal 36 impact aid reimbursement owed for the year; and 37 38 (4) 39 The total amount of federal impact aid paid that year 40 by the Department of Defense; and 41
