## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PREPARE A PROPOSED LIST AND PRIORITIZE PROJECTS TO CREATE SAFE ROUTES FOR SENIOR CITIZENS LIVING IN HOUSING UNITS, RENTALS, HOTELS, CONDOMINIUMS, AND RESIDENTIAL PLACES STATEWIDE.

1 WHEREAS, independent living capabilities for Hawaii's senior population continues to be an integral component for 2 health, longevity, and quality of life; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the liberty of movement, travel, and matriculation 5 6 promote and increase a senior citizen's sense of individual autonomy; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, access to pedestrian-safe walkways, pathways, roadways, and other means of travel are essential for trade, 10 commerce, resource gathering, and economic activity; and 11 12 WHEREAS, senior citizen pedestrians may have reduced 13 physical abilities requiring assistive mobility devices, along 14 with losses in hearing, vision, and reflexes that impede safe 15 travel along pathways; and 16 17 WHEREAS, senior citizens may be more susceptible to slips, 18 trips, and falls, due to elevation changes in walkways, 19 20 pathways, and on uneven or slick surfaces; and 21 WHEREAS, in certain areas, senior living homes and 22 23 residences are located in close proximity to major thoroughfares 24 and highways, thereby increasing risk of personal injury and individual safety; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, senior citizens are more likely to need emergency medical care when involved in traffic injuries with motor 28 vehicles and propelled devices, and have a significantly higher 29 fatality rate in the State; now, therefore, 30 31

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 2 that the Department of Transportation is requested to create 3 pedestrian-safe routes and pathways that lead to and from places 4 of residence in such a manner that adheres to the unique needs 5 of the senior citizen population; and 6 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 9 Transportation is requested to work with elected legislators from each community to create a proposed list of pedestrian 10 projects and prioritize their construction while incorporating 11 12 statewide transportation plans, regional transportation plans, and funding opportunities as may be necessary for their 13 14 construction; and 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 16 Transportation is requested to consider the scope of this 17 request to be a statewide implementation of the aforementioned 18 19 subject areas, including the development and implementation of 20 comprehensive safety protocols that identify barriers to safe mobility for the senior citizen population, and seek to provide 21 educational resources to the public regarding road and sidewalk 22 23 safety; and 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 25 26 Transportation is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 27 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 28 29 the Regular Session of 2023; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Transportation. 32

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
