SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TAKE ALL NECESSARY STEPS TO EXPEDITE WORK ON THE MAIPALAOA BRIDGE IN MAILI, OAHU AND IMPROVE TRAFFIC SIGNAL SUPPORT ON THE WAIANAE COAST AND URGING VARIOUS ENTITIES TO WORK TOGETHER TO IMMEDIATELY OPEN THE SECTION OF THE WAIANAE COAST EMERGENCY ACCESS ROAD SYSTEM EXTENDING PAAKEA ROAD OUT TO LUALUALEI NAVAL ROAD FOR PUBLIC USE ON A PERMANENT BASIS.

WHEREAS, Farrington Highway is the main route of travel for 1 communities of the Leeward Coast of Oahu and is the only public 2 highway that leads into and out of the region; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, on a daily basis, frustrated Leeward motorists are 6 caught in gridlock traffic conditions; and 7 8 WHEREAS, Farrington Highway has experienced lane closures 9 or complete shutdowns on numerous occasions due to traffic accidents, severe weather, and other emergency conditions; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Maipalaoa Bridge was last reconstructed in 12 1970 and is severely compromised due to years of deterioration; 13 14 and 15 WHEREAS, a contractor was hired to complete the Maipalaoa 16 Bridge project, with an estimated completion date of spring 17 2022; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the system of roads known as the Waianae Coast 20 Emergency Access Road System (WCEAR) consists of gated roads 21 that are under the jurisdiction of the Department of Emergency 22 Management of the City and County of Honolulu and can be opened 23 when deemed necessary or when requested by the Honolulu Police 24 25 Department; and 26 27 WHEREAS, in 2017, the Legislature of the State of Hawaii adopted House Resolution No. 125, urging the Department of 28

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Transportation to work in conjunction with the Departments of 1 Emergency Management and Transportation Services of the City and 2 County of Honolulu and Honolulu Police Department to analyze and 3 assess the possibility of using the WCEAR on a more permanent 4 5 basis; and 6 7 WHEREAS, this body finds that there is a critical need for 8 an alternate route to bypass the Maipalaoa Bridge construction area to alleviate aforestated circumstances; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, Honolulu's Joint Traffic Management Center can 12 manage traffic flow conditions, including major and minor 13 congestion and other incidents and events; and 14 15 WHEREAS, connecting all of Waianae's vital traffic signals to Honolulu's Joint Traffic Management Center will support a 16 17 proactive response to traffic operations on the Waianae Coast; 18 now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 21 that: 22 23 24 (1)The Department of Transportation is requested to take 25 all necessary steps to expedite work on the Maipalaoa Bridge in Maili, Oahu; 26 27 (2) The Department of Transportation and City and County 28 29 of Honolulu's Department of Transportation Services 30 are requested to work together to expedite the 31 connection of all vital traffic signals on the Waianae 32 Coast to the Joint Traffic Management Center; 33 (3) 34 The Department of Transportation is requested to allocate additional resources to the Waianae Coast to 35 maintain, repair, and secure traffic signals and 36 sensors in a timely manner; and 37 38 (4) The State of Hawaii, City and County of Honolulu, 39 40 federal entities, and private land owners are urged to work together to immediately open the section of the 41 42 Waianae Coast Emergency Access Road System extending

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Paakea Road out to Lualualei Naval Road to be used as 1 a parallel route for the Waianae Coast on a permanent 2 basis; and 3 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 6 Resolution be transmitted to the Division Administrator of the 7 U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Highway Administration - Hawaii Division, Commander of Navy Region 8 Hawaii, Governor, Director of Transportation, Director of the 9 Department of Transportation Services of the City and County of 10 Honolulu, Director of the Department of Emergency Management of 11 the City and County of Honolulu, Chief of Police of the Honolulu 12 Police Department, and President of Pine Ridge Farms, Inc. 13 14 15 16
