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## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO CONVENE AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL TASK FORCE TO RECOMMEND POLICY AND PROVIDE GUIDANCE TO ASSIST THE COUNTY OF HAWAII IN THE ESTABLISHMENT AND FORMATION OF A METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION OR A REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION.

1 WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment Jobs Act has 2 allocated \$358 million to the Metropolitan Planning Organization 3 Highway Planning Funding and \$107 million to Metropolitan 4 Planning Organization Transit Planning Funding to expend within 5 the next five years; and

7 WHEREAS, the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1962 required that 8 metropolitan planning organizations be established to serve as a 9 forum for collaboration among local communities and government 10 agencies and to direct federal funds toward projects that 11 increase access to opportunity and prosperity through improved 12 multimodal pedestrian, bicycle, and transit options; and 13

14 WHEREAS, metropolitan planning organizations are designated 15 by agreement between the Governor and local governments that 16 together represent at least seventy-five percent of the affected 17 population, including the largest incorporated city based on 18 population, or in accordance with procedures established by 19 applicable state and local law; and

21 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation has the 22 responsibility to support statewide transportation goals in the 23 State and work together with the counties to accomplish 24 transportation goals in their respective islands; and 25

26 WHEREAS, there are two established metropolitan planning 27 organizations operating in the State of Hawaii, one located in 28 the County of Maui and the other in the City and County of 29 Honolulu; and

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WHEREAS, according to the 2020 United States Census data, 1 200,629 people reside in the County of Hawaii, where the ability 2 to deliver quality public transportation services is hampered by 3 the sheer geographic distance between urban and rural areas; and 4 5 WHEREAS, in December 2021, the Council of the County of 6 Hawaii passed Resolution No. 262-21, urging the County's 7 Department of Planning to assess the feasibility of establishing 8 9 a metropolitan planning organization for the County of Hawaii; 10 and 11 WHEREAS, in June 2022, data points for urbanized areas will 12 be made available by the United States Census and such data will 13 be provided to the United States Department of Transportation 14 15 and the Governor of the State of Hawaii for determination of metropolitan planning organization formation for urban areas of 16 fifty thousand people or greater; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, when the population for Kailua-Kona, Hilo, or Puna exceeds forty-five thousand people, the Department of 20 Transportation is requested to begin the interim process of 21 establishing a metropolitan planning organization with the 22 23 County of Hawaii in cooperation with the Governor in accordance with title 23 U.S.C. §134(b) and title 49 U.S.C. §5303(c); and 24 25 WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the policy board of 26 the metropolitan planning organization to make decisions that 27 are the result of the continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive 28 transportation planning process and the organization's staff to 29 support and provide technical resources to the policy board; and 30 31 WHEREAS, the County of Hawaii does not have a metropolitan 32 planning organization; now, therefore, 33 34 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 35 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 36 that the Department of Transportation is urged to convene an 37 Intergovernmental Task Force to recommend policy and provide 38 quidance to assist the County of Hawaii to establish and form a 39 metropolitan planning organization or a regional transportation 40 planning organization should the County of Hawaii not meet the 41



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population threshold of the formalization of a metropolitan 1 planning organization, according to the 2020 census; and 2 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is urged to provide the Intergovernmental Task 5 Force with a list of highway projects to be executed within the 6 next four years from the State Transportation Improvement 7 Program to support the development of the metropolitan planning 8 organization's transportation improvement program; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Intergovernmental Task 11 Force is requested to submit a report of its findings and 12 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, if needed 13 14 after review of existing state and federal regulation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 15 the Regular Session of 2023; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Intergovernmental Task 18 Force be dissolved upon submittal of its report; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 21 22 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Transportation, Mayor of the County of Hawaii, Councilmembers of the County of 23 Hawaii, Director of Mass Transit Agency, and Director of 24 Planning and Public Works of the County of Hawaii.
