SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONDUCT A NEEDS ASSESSMENT FOR THE FEASIBILITY AND EFFECTIVENESS OF A DIVISION OF OCEAN AND COASTAL MANAGEMENT WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

WHEREAS, the entire State of Hawaii falls within Hawai'i's 1 coastal zone boundary; and 2 3 WHEREAS, due to its physical location, configuration, and 4 climate, Hawai'i is rich in a number of valuable coastal 5 ecosystems, such as wetlands and reef flats, embayments and 6 sheltered coves, sand beaches, and coral reefs that serve 7 important natural functions, such as providing habitat and 8 breeding grounds for wildlife and living marine resources, 9 natural buffers to the action of storm waters, and a natural 10 laboratory for scientific and biological research. In addition, 11 they provide the basis for recreational and commercial fishing 12 businesses; and 13 14 WHEREAS, demand for coastal recreational opportunities for 15 beach use and water sports continues to rise because of 16 population growth, increased affluence, greater leisure time, 17 and increased tourism; and 18 19 WHEREAS, increasing and competing demands upon the lands 20 and waters of the coastal zone occasioned by population growth 21 and economic development, including requirements for industry, 22 commerce, residential development, transportation and 23 navigation, waste disposal, and harvesting of marine resources 24 have resulted in the loss of living marine resources, reduced 25 groundwater and aquifer recharge areas, increased 26 vulnerabilities to coastal development, reduced living marine 27 resources, wildlife, nutrient-rich areas, permanent and averse 28 changes to ecological systems, decreased open space for public 29 use, increased shoreline erosion, and compromised infrastructure 30 due to erosion and coastal flooding; and 31 32 WHEREAS, climate change will result in substantial sea 33 level rise with serious adverse effects in the coastal zone. 34



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Seventy percent of beaches in Hawai'i are experiencing coastal
erosion and many miles of beach have been severely narrowed or
lost over the past century; and

5 WHEREAS, Hawai'i has a substantial and significant interest 6 in the protection, management, and development of ocean and 7 coastal resources; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources, 9 Office of Conservation and Coastal Lands, is responsible for the 10 11 management of coastal resources including beaches, dunes, and rocky shorelines seaward of county jurisdictions or within the 12 State Conservation District. The Coastal Lands Program is 13 responsible for coordinating coastal management, maintaining the 14 delicate balance between conservation of coastal resources and 15 responsible development of coastal areas, mitigating risks from 16 natural and human-induced hazards for coastal communities, and 17 implementing innovative shoreline management techniques; and 18 19

WHEREAS, in 1972, the Legislature authorized the Department 20 of Planning and Economic Development to prepare a plan for the 21 management of the State's coastal zones to comply with the 22 requirements of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act, which 23 provided that the state Land Use Commission has the authority to 24 administer land and water use regulations in coastal zones, 25 control development to ensure compliance with the State's 26 management program in coastal zones, and resolve conflicts among 27 competing uses in coastal zones; and 28 29

30 WHEREAS, in 1977, the Legislature established the Coastal Zone Management Program within the Office of Planning and 31 Sustainable Development of the Department of Business, Economic 32 The Office of Planning and Development, and Tourism. 33 Sustainable Development's purpose is to provide central 34 direction and cohesion in the allocation of resources and 35 effectuation of state activities and programs, and effectively 36 address current or emerging issues and opportunities. The 37 purpose of the Coastal Zone Management Program is to provide for 38 the effective management, beneficial use, protection, and 39 development of the coastal zone; and 40

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WHEREAS, through the Office of Planning and Sustainable 1 Development's Coastal Zone Management Program and enactment of 2 chapter 205A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Legislature 3 established a network program, whereby the program works with a 4 network of state agencies and local governments to administer 5 and enforce all laws, regulations, and policies that protect the 6 coastal zone; and 7 8 WHEREAS, Hawai'i's environment is both undermanaged and 9 overregulated and new regulatory mechanisms should not be added 10 onto, but rather combined into, the existing systems; now, 11 therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 14 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 15 that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested 16 to conduct a needs assessment for the feasibility and 17 effectiveness of a Division of Ocean and Coastal Management; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Division of Ocean and 20 Coastal Management would be the designated state coastal 21 management agency and be responsible for the implementation and 22 administration of Hawai'i's coastal zone management program, 23 including the direct regulation of coastal resources within the 24 critical areas of the State including coastal waters, tidelines, 25 beaches, and beach dune systems and the consideration of 26 ecological, cultural, aesthetic, recreational, scenic, open 27 space values, public access, coastal hazards, sea level rise, 28 and needs for economic development; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Division of Ocean and 31 Coastal Management should effectively manage networks of healthy 32 coral reefs while improving the health of reef ecosystems at 33 priority sites, identify and fill in management gaps that inform 34 existing efforts to prevent further damage to fragile nearshore 35 ecosystems, and supplement existing efforts to address the 36 effects of sea level rise; and 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 39 Natural Resources is requested to submit a report of its 40

41 findings and recommendations, including any proposed

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legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 1 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 4 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Business, Economic 5 Development, and Tourism and Chairperson of the Board of Land 6 and Natural Resources. 7 8 9 10 OFFERED BY:
