# SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I TO ESTABLISH CULTURALLY APPROPRIATE CURRICULUM TO TRAIN COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS AND TO INCORPORATE DISTANCE-LEARNING FOR NEIGHBOR ISLAND STUDENTS.

1           WHEREAS, for more than twenty years, community health  
2 workers have improved the quality of life for residents in the  
3 State by providing a critical service to connect disadvantaged  
4 populations with culturally appropriate health care resources;  
5 and

7           WHEREAS, over two thousand community health workers  
8 actively engage with local communities through community-based  
9 organizations, local health care facilities, clinics, or  
10 hospitals; and

11  
12           WHEREAS, there is an imminent need to recognize the work  
13 and contributions of community health workers in the State; and

14  
15           WHEREAS, a certification program for community health  
16 workers administered by the Department of Commerce and Consumer  
17 Affairs is needed to sustain community health workers as a  
18 professional health care path in Hawai'i; and

19  
20           WHEREAS, in rural, isolated communities throughout the  
21 State, community health workers are invaluable, as residents  
22 rely on community health workers to drive long distances through  
23 difficult terrain to provide health care resources; and

24  
25           WHEREAS, as Hawai'i's communities, from urban to rural, have  
26 diverse, unique experiences, there is a growing need for  
27 curriculum used in community health worker courses to be  
28 culturally appropriate for the communities served; and

29  
30           WHEREAS, utilizing culturally appropriate curriculum allow  
31 community health workers to engage with their communities while  
32 also learning best practices, training techniques, and relevant  
33 topics that focus on a community-based approach; and



1 WHEREAS, as some of Hawai'i's communities experience  
2 inequities with access to health care workers and educational  
3 opportunities, providing equitable access to community health  
4 worker trainings for neighbor islands through distance-learning  
5 programs may provide further opportunities for Hawai'i's people  
6 aspiring to enter the health care profession; now, therefore,  
7

8 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first  
9 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022,  
10 that the University of Hawai'i is requested to:  
11

- 12 (1) Establish culturally appropriate curriculum to train  
13 community health workers;
- 14
- 15 (2) Incorporate distance-learning options for neighbor  
16 island students interested in the community health  
17 worker profession; and
- 18
- 19 (3) Identify other methods to align community health  
20 worker programs with the needs of the communities they  
21 serve; and

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the University of Hawai'i is  
24 requested to submit a report of its findings and  
25 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the  
26 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of  
27 the Regular Session of 2023; and

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
30 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce and  
31 Consumer Affairs, Auditor, President of the University of  
32 Hawai'i, Chancellor of Kapi'olani Community College, and Director  
33 of Hawai'i Community College - Pālanuanui.
