## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONDUCT AN ELECTRICAL ASSESSMENT OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR PURPOSES OF HEAT ABATEMENT AND AIR FILTRATION UPGRADES.

WHEREAS, hot classroom temperatures in Hawai'i's public 1 schools can adversely affect students by making them drowsy, 2 irritable, and unmotivated; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Hawai'i's overheated classrooms can also cause 5 students to suffer headaches, nausea, heat rashes, heat 6 7 exhaustion, and, in severe cases, heat stroke; and 8 WHEREAS, studies show that while classroom temperatures 9 over eighty degrees can negatively impact student achievement, 10 temperatures in Hawai'i's classrooms are regularly recorded at 11 over one hundred degrees during certain periods of the school 12 year; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Legislature appropriated funds under Act 47, 15 Session Laws of Hawaii 2016 (Act 47), for purposes of heat 16 abatement upgrades for Department of Education schools; and 17 18 WHEREAS, despite the funds appropriated under Act 47, more 19 than five thousand Department of Education schools remain in 20 need of heat abatement upgrades; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the ability to implement heat abatement upgrades 23 depends in large part on electrical capacity and improvements to 24 increase electrical capacity; and 25 26 WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic 27 has exposed the need for air purification measures in school 28 classrooms, placing further demand on electrical capacity; now, 29 30 therefore, 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 32 33 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, that the Department of Education is requested to conduct an 34



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electrical assessment on all public and conversion charter 1 schools in the State; and 2 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the requested assessment shall 5 determine whether, for each school, electrical capacity is sufficient to support the installation of air conditioning units 6 and air purifying devices in classrooms, and for each classroom, 7 the assessment shall indicate the level of electrical capacity 8 needed; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 11 12 requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 13 14 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and 15 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of Education. 18 19 20 21 OFFERED BY:
