SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT JULY 31 OF EVERY YEAR BE RECOGNIZED AND PROCLAIMED AS LA HO'IHO'I EA.

WHEREAS, La Ho'iho'i Ea translates to Restoration Day and 1 2 marks the day that independence was restored to the Hawaiian Kingdom on July 31, 1843, after being forcefully seized by Lord 3 4 George Paulet, a captain in the British Royal Navy; and 5 WHEREAS, recognizing that the Kingdom of Hawaii was a 6 sovereign state, Queen Victoria sent Admiral Richard Darton 7 Thomas of the British Royal Navy to redress the unwarranted 8 9 transgression against the Hawaiian Kingdom; and 10 WHEREAS, July 31 commemorates the end of the unauthorized 11 five-month military occupation; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, King Kamehameha III established this holiday in a days-long celebration following the rightful return of 15 sovereignty to the Kingdom of Hawaii, officially proclaiming, 16 "Ua Mau ke ea o ka 'āina i ka pono", meaning the ea--or breath, 17 life, and sovereignty--of the land is perpetuated through 18 19 justice; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the Senate of the State of Hawaii recognizes that there is a need to honor, support, and cherish this significant 22 day in Hawaii's history; now, therefore, 23 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 25 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 26 that the Legislature and Governor are requested to recognize and 27 acknowledge the historical and cultural significance of La 28 Ho'iho'i Ea; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that July 31 of each year be 31 designated and observed as "La Ho'iho'i Ea", in recognition of 32 the day independence was restored to the Kingdom of Hawaii; and 33 34
