## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT OF PROPOSED MANDATORY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has long been a leader in advancing 1 reproductive rights and advocating for equitable and affordable 2 access to sexual and reproductive health care; and 3 4 WHEREAS, federal protections for abortion, preventative 5 care, contraceptives, and other sexual and reproductive health 6 care services are consistently threatened, making state 7 protections for these services especially critical; and 8 9 WHEREAS, other states have enacted laws that effectively 10 11 eliminate abortion access in the states, reflecting a broad strategy to challenge and overturn the United States Supreme 12 Court's holding in Roe v. Wade, which protects abortion access; 13 and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Trump administration made it difficult for 16 insurers to cover abortion care and assembled a Supreme Court 17 that may restrict abortion access and strike down the Patient 18 Protection and Affordable Care Act; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, eliminating the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act would force many Hawaii residents to pay more out-of-22 23 pocket health care costs, leading many to delay or forego needed 24 care; and 25 26 WHEREAS, access to sexual and reproductive health care, including no-cost preventive services, is critical for the 27 health and economic security of all people in Hawaii and will 28 29 help avoid more costly treatments in the future; and 30 WHEREAS, House Bill No. 249, originally introduced during 31 the Regular Session of 2021, would prohibit discrimination in 32



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the provision of sexual and reproductive health care services 1 2 and requires health insurers, mutual benefit societies, and 3 health maintenance organizations to provide coverage without 4 cost-sharing for a range of reproductive health services, drugs, 5 devices, products, and procedures; and 6

7 WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that, before considering any legislative measure that mandates 8 9 health insurance coverage for specific health services, specific diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part 10 11 of individual or group health insurance policies, the 12 Legislature shall pass a concurrent resolution asking the Auditor to prepare and submit to the Legislature a report that 13 14 assesses the social and financial effects of the proposed 15 mandatory coverage; now, therefore,

17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senatethe House of Representatives concurring of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of 18 19 Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, that the Auditor is requested to conduct a social and financial assessment of House Bill No. 20 249, which was introduced during the Regular Session of 2021; 21 22 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 24 submit a report of the Auditor's findings and recommendations, 25 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later 26 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 27 28 of 2023; and

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor, Director of Commerce 31 and Consumer Affairs, and Insurance Commissioner. 32
