SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ISSUE CERTIFICATES OF STILLBIRTH.

WHEREAS, according to the Department of Health, all 1 2 products of conception require the reporting of either a fetal death or a live birth in the State; and 3 4 WHEREAS, birth certificates are not issued for stillbirths 5 in Hawaii; and 6 7 WHEREAS, United States Standard of Certificates of Birth, 8 Death, and Fetal Death are mandated by federal law; and 9 10 WHEREAS, under the National Center for Health Statistics, 11 reports of fetal deaths (US Standard Report of Fetal Death) are 12 completed separately from certificates of birth (U.S. Standard 13 Certificate of Live Birth) and certificates of death (U.S. 14 Standard Certificate of Death); and 15 16 WHEREAS, United States vital statistics are collected and 17 published through a decentralized, cooperative system; and 18 19 WHEREAS, in the United States, there is no federal birth 20 registry, rather birth certificates are issued by the states, 21 which are obligated under law to report annual vital statistics 22 data to the federal government; and 23 24 WHEREAS, there is not a required standard birth certificate 25 document that states must issue to individuals, and as such, 26 states may produce their own birth certificate documents for 27 distribution to individuals; and 28 29 WHEREAS, some states, including Colorado, Connecticut, 30 Kansas, New York, Oregon, and Pennsylvania, issue certificates 31 of stillbirth; and 32 33

1 WHEREAS, it is appropriate and necessary to issue birth certificates for stillbirths in the State for several factors, 2 3 including: 4 5 (1)According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, stillbirth affects one in one hundred 6 7 sixty births, and each year about twenty-four thousand 8 babies are stillborn in the United States, the number 9 of which affects a significant number of lives; 10 11 (2)The sheer number of stillbirths in the United States has a profound and long-lasting impact on bereaved 12 13 parents, health care professionals, and loved ones; 14 15 (3) According to a November 18, 2021, journal article, "Depression, Anxiety, PTSD, and OCD After Stillbirth: 16 A Systematic Review", by the National Institutes of 17 18 Health, parents who experience stillbirth have a considerably higher risk of reporting symptoms of 19 depression, anxiety, and PTSD compared with parents 20 21 with live births; 22 23 (4) The experiences, process, and connection of parents to their unborn child through pregnancy and sometimes 24 labor, delivery, and birth are the same for liveborn 25 infants and stillborn infants; 26 27 (5) Having only a certificate of fetal death is a constant 28 reminder of the death of a child, rather than the 29 duration of life of a child; and 30 31 (6) A certificate of stillbirth would acknowledge and 32 33 respect the existence of life and how fleeting it can 34 sometimes be to the baby, parents, and loved ones; 35 now, therefore, 36 37 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 38 39 that the Department of Health is requested to issue certificates of stillbirth; and 40 41

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 1 2 requested to issue a certificate of stillbirth to the parent or parents named on a fetal death certificate issued in the case of 3 a stillbirth, upon request of the parent or parents; and 4 5 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is requested to assess the feasibility of issuing certificates of 7 8 stillbirths in the State; and 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 10 requested to submit a report of its findings and 11 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, regarding 12 the implementation of certificates of stillbirths in the State, 13 14 to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 17 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health. 18 19 20 OFFERED BY: 21
