This foundation was born in the world when Assembly of God Hawaii Cedar Church located in Kalihi, Honolulu started a homeless relief project, foodbank services in 2004, and opened the House of Love, a rehabilitation center for drug patients in 2005. In September 2009, in celebration of the 35th anniversary of the founding do Hawaii Cedar Church, the church and social welfare work were separated and the HI Good Samaritan Foundation was established (regardless of the church).

Since then, the HI Good Samaritan Foundation has been completely separated from the church and has been conducting social welfare work independently by creating a separate foundation and is registered with the IRS in 2020. Currently, at the location we call "Homeless Town", there are four old houses built in 1934 in which 19 no or low-income individuals resides. 54 homeless individuals temporarily stay at the 54 units of outdoor sheds. Our plan is to create a homeless town consisting of 120 units at the location. Approximately 50% of the homeless individuals staying at Good Samaritan Foundation's property are suffering from depression, drug abuse, or other mental, physical, or emotional issues. Our foundation plans to implement a program for these individuals' rehabilitations. For the operation of such program, it will require routine services of doctors, nurses, and social workers. There are about 7500 homeless individuals in Oahu and about 500 in Waianae area. We would like to accommodate as many as possible but currently facility has limit to host them and we endeavor to expend the facility and staffs to help them and educate them to rehabilitate.

This foundation also started a job training program for the homeless individuals in 2021. At the present time, twenty-five individuals are receiving two-year job training. The foundation supports those who completed the program so that they may work as food truck operators, message therapists, or as seminarians, and more.

This foundation has a good intention and has accomplished good results so far but has faced financial challenges at this time. Most of work done by volunteers and donations from random individuals and church members but honestly most of them are so tired and short of financial resources at this time and really need support from the State.

HI Good Samaritan Foundation is aware of that homeless issue in this island is a serious and important social matter and we are endeavoring to resolve the issue with all our best.

The goals and objectives related to the request ;

Our goal is to provide a safe and secure environment for current homeless individuals to stay and to be trained for their rehabilitations so that they could live and sustain lives with dignity in love and care. The objective of this project is to accommodate at least 70 individuals in the year of 2023. Currently the residents uses bathrooms and there are only two shower rooms that were remodeled from homeless warehouses but these are way shorter than what are actually needed. We believe they need at least five shower rooms, five bathrooms and one large dining room. We have a vision to build a building that could accommodate about 120 homeless individuals and provide vocational educations to them but for the year of 2023 to 2024, the most urgent requests for the fund are to remodel the old homes in the town and to install bathrooms and shower rooms as well as to staff instructors for the vocational training courses for the homeless individuals.

3. The public purpose and need to be served ;

Sadly, we have numerous homeless / houseless people around us. Whether they were challenged by financially, physically or/and mentally, those less fortunate neighbors are still human beings with dignity who deserve a life with care and love especially a roof over their heads, which the rest of us should share the burden of serving them till they can sustain lives on their own. Therefore, the foundation is willingly and actively pursuing the venues and ways to assist their living by providing them with some basic minimal accommodations like places to sleep, water to shower and vocation training courses that they can learn their job skills from and more.

We need to renovate the four old houses built in 1934 so that at least 45 individuals may reside in those four houses but still more accommodation facilities would be needed. Approximately 50% of the homeless individuals staying at Good Samaritan Foundation's property are suffering from depression, drug abuse, or other mental, physical, or emotional issues. Our foundation plans to implement a program for these individuals' rehabilitations. For the operation of such program, it will require routine services of doctors, nurses, and social workers.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

There are numerous homeless individuals in this island alone. We may not be able to serve all of them, but we would do our best to accommodate at least 70 individuals and provide vocational training programs to them in 2023.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The property of the Foundation that homeless individuals can stay is in Waianae area, the west side of Oahu island therefore we could cover more individuals in that side of the island than in town side.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

Funding provided by the State of Hawaii Gran in Aid (GIA) program will be used to repair very old 4 houses built in around 1934 where homeless people are residing as the homes are physically and literally falling apart and to install/facilitate the utilities including powerlines and water, sewer lines into the properties. The fund also will be used to pay the vocational program instructors and a managing personnel for the whole project who would manage the houses and training programing and search instructors available and more.

 Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

The home repairs will be done yearly portion by portion as the rundown homes need lots of care for the next 3-5 years. And the vocational training programs will be provided to the homeless individuals throughout the year and should be continued if there are homeless individuals in the properties.

The home repair project shall be through bids among the trusted construction companies. The expense used for the repair shall be provided to the GIA and the inspection could be done by the GIA program team if necessary. For vocational training program shall be evaluated quarterly by the learners to check if those programs could be improved further on the line.
