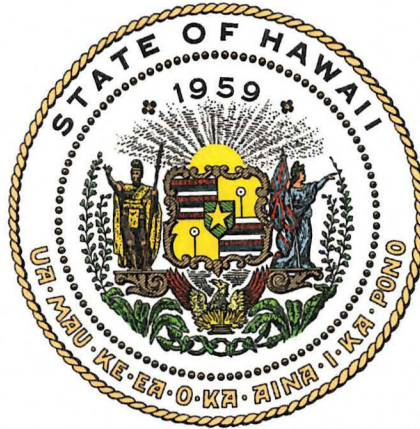





II. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

Located on the Big Island of Hawaii, is MX808 Association, this track is situated behind the county landfill in Hilo, Hawaii, across the Hilo Race Strip. Currently there are approximately 30 acres of undeveloped land at the motocross, and 4 acre's of a developed parcel that is managed by MX808 Association.

In 2005, MX808/ATV association was started, by a father who's son just wanted to ride his bike. He was riding a motocross track in waimea until it closed, thus started this journey to open a track in hilo. With the help of the former mayor, and lots of friends, MX808/ATV association started. With the support from the community, numerous donations, continuous commitment and lots of labor or love, MX808ATV opened up its first track in hilo in 2005. And this son, hilo's very own made it to pro racing in California, racing in the supercross to test new dirt bikes for motocross action magazine, while being the first person from Hawaii to make the cover of MXA magazine. While you might find several celebrity riders, our Hilo's own is undisputed royalty at the track. A few years later a rider from kona also a member of MX808 ATV, turned pro-motocross outdoor series.

The name has changed in 2010 to MX808 Association, with the same goals and missions for all motocross riders, MX808 Association incorporated with the State of Hawaii, registered as of January 2022 and as of March 2022 we just received a 501©3 non-profit determination status.

The current needs are; with more kids, more riders, quads and not enough area for them to ride. We have time slots, for each age group, so everyone can ride. Our veteran, senior, riders, ride with the teens, and we put a halt on everyone a couple times during the day and let the keiki ages 3-8 ride, then we have quads.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

The Mission of MX808 Association is to "turn Today's Amateurs into Tomorrow's Pros". MX808's vision is to provide a safe and fair competitive environment for a thriving Big Island Motorsport Community. Our Mission is to bring together Motorsports enthusiasts of all levels, and ages as we help grow and better the sport of motocross in a "safe environment". To promote the motocross "lifestyle" and protect the "future" of motocross, as we share the intense feeling that only the sport of motocross can give.

The "Goal" for MX808 Association, is to have enough riding area for all the age groups. The age group that is struggling right now is the keiki's, ages 3-8 years of age. A proper keiki track would include tabletop jumps, with a more and or less base landing area, and a rectangle jump with a few humps, some doubles, and a few long runs for our keiki's to practice. With, the unimproved area, we want to build a new keiki track, the undeveloped forested terrain has albesia 40-50 ft tall, gun powder trees and ohia growing with a rocky porous type of ground, no soil, some caves, and taverns throughout, that would need to be carefully collapsed, sunk-in, compacted and refilled for safety. Although, there are great drainage, everything else needs to be brought in. Sand, dirt, mulch such as green waste and cinder is preferably the best material for the base, and also used to coat the jumps and berms, for a softer landing.

We have a new design for the keiki track. Equipment will be needed to cut out and shape the tracks. We have selected a multi-purpose track loader as part of our needs, for the ongoing construction and long-term maintenance for the entire track. This unit will support and serve our current and ongoing needs as follows:

- 1) Takeuchi track loader included with the 4in1 bucket, to transport move materials, spread materials,

Additional purchase of attachments are as follows later:

- 1) a maintenance mower to cut and maintain the grass areas
- 2) a dozer blade attachment used for shaping jumps and berms, after a race and before the track opens
- 3) a water buggy with trailer – which connects to the track loader to transport water to the tracks to cut down on dust control, and emergency purposes
- 4) a mulching/grinding head to open new underdeveloped areas. Maintain any areas unable to use the mower. Create mulch to use on tracks.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

The track is open to all ages, there's a track for every type of rider, it's hardly a competitive scene, it's more of a "hey... howzit atmosphere", all the riders rub shoulders - and fenders. Younger kids zoom around on tiny 50cc bikes, some with training wheels. The consensus is to introduce your toddler to strider bikes that have electric motors built in, once they've mastered the basics of balance, you can add a battery pack and send them to the kiddie track. MX808's last 2 events hosted, we had over 200 riders of all ages, and believe it or not, we have some awesome young women riders, while proving that "women can ride too", its not just a sport for guys.

4. Describe the target population to be served;

From Keiki, to teenagers, young women, novice to veteran, "riders" they all make their way to the dirt track. Kids seem to outnumber the adults. And since, MX808 Motocross is the only legal track on the Big Island, riders come from as far as kona to ride, and its open to all ages. Hilo hosted the Mauna Kea 200, which was shut down after 1 season. Motocross as a sport, is nowhere near the popularity that it is today. 250cc four stroke

engines are common, they are heavier and less temperamental, but with a smoother ride and better mileage. Aspiring pros might choose 125cc two stroke, which are higher performing. The quads ride next on the track, since quads are wider and flatter than the dirt bikes. And then it's the Keiki ages 4-8. MX808's with Hawaii Motocross Association together organizes fourth of July weekend races. MX808's last 2 events hosted September 2022, & October 2022 hosted about 200 riders at each event.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

MX808 motocross track is in the district of Hilo. It is located back of the Hilo County Landfill. Onto a roughly paved road, you get the feeling you're lost or trespassing, on this obscure road, that leads you a land of "*man and machine*", across of the Hilo Racetrack, on the Big Island, a mecca location for the mechanically obsessed, the "epicenter" of Hilo's dirt bike world, is MX808 Association. The Land is owned by the County of Hawaii. Race day's is made up trailers, pop up tents, homemade hale's, and makeshift garages, where almost every pop-up tent are full of coolers, snacks, and families who are excited, and by end of day exhausted!

The population in Hilo is close to 47,000 people. Often referred to as the Big Island since it is nearly twice as large as all the other Hawaiian Islands. Hilo is a place that takes immense pride in its culture and history. Hilo is home to the exciting Merry Monarch Festival, with lots of beaches, waterfalls, gardens, also known for the best national parks, and two of the most active volcanoes on the planet. The average temperature in Hilo is approx. 70-75 degrees, with an average rainfall of about 10-14 inches. For science enthusiasts visiting hilo, can take a tour to the Mauna Loa observatory, or to the summit of Mauna Kea. You can be at 4,000 ft elevation in Waimea and within 12 minutes be a sea level at kawaihae, *only on the Big Island*.

MX808 Association and Hilo Racetrack Association, shares the entry roadway. MX808 with the approval of the County of Hawaii will construct and develop its own entrance roadway, and add on to the existing parking lot, to place finish grade material on roadway and install a fence to separate both the associations. The distance is approx. 1400 feet in length, and approx. 30 ft wide. By using a D-9 bulldozer to define/rip for grade, and to smooth out the roadway roadbed. Spread and compact 1-1/2" basecourse material as a subbase grade. The labor, from various sub-contractors and contractors will be as in-kind services of donation, while the donation and use of equipment, to spread, and compact the basecourse. And install the 6ft chain-link fencing, gates which separates both entrances. Define/rip regrade, extend and open up the existing parking lot, while

providing more parking stalls for attendees. To rip, grub and shape with a d-9 bulldozer the New Keiki Track. With this separation MX808 could clearly allow visitors, participants, its own members entrance to hold weekend racing events/activities more often. With the new keiki track, our keiki will have their own track to ride on and compete while having fun.

MX808 is not seeking any funding for the project manager, as presently that position will be managed by John Lopez, the president of MX808. He will be responsible for the oversight of all development related processes – which will include procurement, timeliness, cost and fiscal management. John Lopez will work with all contracted parties to ensure that the project, will be completed in a timely manner and according to specifications. The development process will be tracked and logged on a weekly, monthly, quarterly basis of each designated phase of the contract.

By the end of 2023, our timeline is as soon as we get funding, 6 months to completion of all projects set forth in this grant.


