A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECORD DISPOSITION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide greater 2 uniformity, flexibility, and efficiency in handling and maintaining state ethics commission records. 3 4 SECTION 2. Section 84-17.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 6 "(a) All financial disclosure statements filed by a legislator, employee, or delegate to a constitutional convention 7 shall be maintained by the state ethics commission for a period 8 9 of six years from the date of the financial disclosure 10 statement's filing. Upon the expiration of the six-year period, the financial disclosure statement and all copies thereof 11 12 [shall] may be destroyed.

(b) Upon the expiration of six years after an election for which a candidate for state elective office or a constitutional convention has filed a financial disclosure statement, the state ethics commission [shall] may destroy the candidate's financial disclosure statement and all copies thereof."

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1 SECTION 3. Section 97-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§97-4 Manner of filing; public records. All statements 4 required by this chapter to be filed with the state ethics 5 commission: 6 (1)Shall be deemed properly filed when delivered or 7 deposited in an established post office within the 8 prescribed time; duly stamped, registered, or 9 certified; and directed to the state ethics 10 commission; provided that in the event it is not 11 received, a duplicate of the statement shall be 12 promptly filed upon notice by the state ethics 13 commission of its nonreceipt; and 14 (2) Shall be maintained by the state ethics commission for 15 a period of no less than six years from the date of 16 filing; and shall constitute part of the public 17 records of the state ethics commission." 18 SECTION 4. This Act shall apply to all disclosures that 19 were filed before the effective date of this Act and that are in 20 the state ethics commission's possession and control.

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SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
