RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 education is finding it more difficult to attract and retain 3 qualified licensed behavior analysts for the public school 4 system. Staff shortages lead to students not obtaining adequate 5 support in their education. While the department continues to build its internal capacity for its applied behavior analysis 6 7 services to meet the licensure requirements under chapter 465D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, a large portion of the services 8 9 provided must be contracted through a statewide contract at a 10 high cost. To be able to continue providing adequate support to 11 students, the department requires options to utilize qualified 12 and competent personnel who may be able to implement applied 13 behavior analysis services in direct collaboration with a 14 licensed behavior analyst or licensed psychologist.

15 The purpose of this Act is to:

16 (1) Reinstate and make permanent the exemption from the
17 behavior analyst licensing requirements for teachers

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1		working in collaboration with a licensed behavior	
2		analyst or licensed psychologist;	
3	(2)	Expand the exemption for registered behavior	
4		technicians to implement applied behavior analysis	
5		services under the direction of a licensed	
6		psychologist;	
7	(3)	Reinstate and make permanent the exemption for	
8		individuals who implement applied behavior analysis	
9		services to participants in the medicaid home and	
10		community-based services waiver program; and	
11	(4)	Require the department of education to report to the	
12		legislature on the status of implementing medicaid	
13		reimbursements for applied behavior analysis services.	
14	SECT	ION 2. Section 465D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
15	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
16	"(a)	This chapter is not intended to restrict the practice	
17	of other licensed or credentialed practitioners practicing		
18	within their own recognized scopes of practice and shall not		
19	apply to:		
20	(1)	A licensed psychologist and any supervisee of the	
21		licensed psychologist; provided that applied behavior	

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1 analysis services performed are within the boundaries 2 of the licensed psychologist's education, training, 3 and competence; provided further that neither the licensed psychologist nor any supervisee of the 4 5 licensed psychologist purports to be a licensed 6 behavior analyst; [and] provided further that master's 7 level practitioners and postdoctoral fellows may 8 provide training and supervision to direct support 9 workers, paraprofessionals, caregivers, parents, and 10 guardians in a manner and to the extent determined by 11 the supervising licensed psychologist.

For purposes of this paragraph, "supervisee" means a master's level practitioner, postdoctoral fellow, direct support worker, paraprofessional, caregiver, parent, or guardian who provides applied behavior analysis services;

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1		provided that for purposes of this paragraph, "direct
2		support worker" means a paraprofessional who directly
3		implements intervention or assessment plans under
4		supervision and does not design intervention or
5		assessment plans; or a licensed psychologist;
6	(5)	A family member, legal guardian, or caregiver
7		implementing an applied behavior analysis plan and who
8	· ·	acts under the direction of a licensed behavior
9		analyst or Hawaii-licensed psychologist; provided that
10		for the purposes of this paragraph, "caregiver" means
11		an individual who provides habilitative services in an
12		adult foster home, developmental disabilities
13		domiciliary home, adult residential care home,
14		expanded adult residential care home, special
15		treatment facility, or therapeutic living program
16		pursuant to the medicaid home and community-based
17		services waiver program authorized by section 1915(c)
18		of the Social Security Act;
19	(6)	An individual who [designs or] implements applied
20		behavior analysis services to participants in the
21		medicaid home and community-based [service] <u>services</u>

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1		waiver program pursuant to section 1915(c) of the
2		Social Security Act [on or before January 1, 2024];
3	(7)	An individual who engages in the practice of applied
. 4		behavior analysis with nonhuman or nonpatient clients
5		or consumers, including but not limited to applied
6		animal behaviorists and practitioners of
7		organizational behavior management;
8	(8)	A matriculated graduate student or postdoctoral fellow
9		whose activities are part of a defined applied
10		behavior analysis program of study, practicum, or
11	•	intensive practicum; provided that the student's or
12		fellow's activities or practice is directly supervised
13		by a licensed behavior analyst, licensed psychologist,
14		or an instructor from a nationally recognized training
15		organization or in a Behavior Analyst Certification
16		Board-approved course sequence; or
17	(9)	An individual pursuing experience in applied behavior
18		analysis consistent with the Behavior Analyst
19		Certification Board's experience requirements;
20		provided that the experience is supervised by a
21		licensed behavior analyst."

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1 SECTION 3. The department of education shall submit a report to the legislature no later than February 1, 2024, on the 2 3 status of implementing medicaid reimbursements for applied 4 behavior analysis services provided in public schools.

5 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 6

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SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
