Pursuant to Chapter 302D-28, HRS, the non-facility general fund per-pupil funding request for Charter School (CS) students shall be the same as the general fund per- pupil amount to the DOE in the most recently approved executive budget recommendation for the DOE and shall be based upon reasonable projected enrollment figures for all CS. As such, the proposed transfer of \$5,000,000 will be allocated on a per pupil basis to ensure equitable funding with the Department of Education.
