A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE FUNDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
3	immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
4	the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.
5	SECTION 2. The legislature finds that the federal funding
6	received under the American Rescue Plan Act required states
7	receiving elementary and secondary school emergency relief
8	(ESSER) program III funds to meet certain maintenance of effort
9	requirements by maintaining state support for elementary and
10	secondary education in fiscal year 2022-2023 at least at the
11	proportional level of the State's support for elementary and
12	secondary education relative to the State's overall spending,
13	averaged over fiscal years 2016-2017, 2017-2018 and 2018-2019.
14	If the State fails to meet these maintenance of efforts
15	requirements, the United States Department of Education has the
16	authority to impose a range of enforcement options, including

- 1 seeking recovery of the approximately \$412,300,000 in ESSER
- 2 program III funds awarded to the state department of education.
- 3 As the State of Hawaii's economy has improved and general
- 4 fund revenues have rebounded, the maintenance of effort
- 5 obligation has become increasingly difficult to manage, in part
- 6 due to certain large general fund appropriations made in fiscal
- 7 year 2021-2022 and fiscal year 2022-2023 for non-educational
- 8 purposes. These appropriations were made for worthy purposes
- 9 but have the impact of increasing the denominator for
- 10 maintenance of effort calculations if expended in fiscal year
- 11 2022-2023. However, these worthy purposes would not be
- 12 adversely affected by statutory adjustments to modestly delay
- 13 expenditures beyond fiscal year 2022-2023 so the expenditures no
- 14 longer impact the maintenance of effort calculations.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to reduce the potential for
- 16 federal maintenance of effort enforcement actions against the
- 17 State by delaying the encumbrance and expenditure of various
- 18 large general fund appropriations made in the 2022 legislative
- 19 session until or beyond July 1, 2023, so they are no longer part
- 20 of the fiscal year 2022-2023 maintenance of effort calculation.

- 2 SECTION 3. The legislature finds that Act 220, Session
- 3 Laws of Hawaii 2022, transferred the stadium authority from the
- 4 department of accounting and general services to the department
- 5 of business, economic development, and tourism for
- 6 administrative purposes. Section 14 of Act 220 also transferred
- 7 appropriations made for the stadium authority to the department
- 8 of business, economic development, and tourism.
- 9 The legislature further finds that a modest delay in
- 10 encumbrance and expenditure of the lump sum general fund
- 11 appropriation in fiscal year 2023 for deposit into the stadium
- 12 development special fund made in Act 88, Session Laws of Hawaii
- 13 2021, as amended by Act 248, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, would
- 14 not have an adverse effect.
- 15 The purpose of this part is to delay the encumbrance and
- 16 expenditure of the fiscal year 2023 appropriation for deposit
- 17 into the stadium development special fund made in the 2022
- 18 legislative session to beyond July 1, 2023, so that it is no
- 19 longer part of the fiscal year 2023 maintenance of effort
- 20 calculation.

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         SECTION 4. Act 88, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, as amended
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    by paragraph 20 of section 4 of Act 248, Session Laws of Hawaii
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    2022, is amended by amending section 17.3 to read as follows:
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         "SECTION 17.3. Provided that out of the general fund
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    appropriation for [spectator events and shows - Aloha Stadium
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    (AGS889), stadium authority (BED180), the sum of [$49,500,000]

    $ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
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    year 2022-2023 shall be deposited into the stadium development

    special fund, to be expended for stadium costs for operations,
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    maintenance, and contract costs to developers of the stadium [-];

    provided that any unexpended or unencumbered balances from the

    appropriation shall lapse to the general fund on June 30, 2024;

    provided further that funds shall not be expended nor deposited
14
    into the stadium development special fund before July 1, 2023."

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         SECTION 5. Act 115, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, is
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    amended by amending section 4 to read as follows:
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         "SECTION 4. In accordance with article VII, section 6, of
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    the Hawaii State Constitution, there is appropriated out of the
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    general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of

    [\$300,000,000] $ or so much thereof as may be
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- 1 necessary for fiscal year [2022-2023] 2023-2024 for deposit into
- 2 the pension accumulation fund established under section 88-114,
- 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes."
- 4 PART IV
- 5 SECTION 6. Act 236, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, is
- 6 amended by amending section 3 to read as follows:
- 7 "SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of [\$300,000,000]
- 9 \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 10 year 2022-2023 to be deposited into the rental housing revolving
- 11 fund established in section 201H-202, Hawaii Revised
- 12 Statutes [-]; provided that any unexpended or unencumbered
- 13 balances from the appropriation shall lapse to the general fund
- 14 on June 30, 2024; provided further that funds shall not be
- 15 expended nor deposited into the rental housing revolving fund
- 16 before July 1, 2023."
- 17 PART V
- 18 SECTION 7. Act 296, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, is
- 19 amended by amending section 6 to read as follows:
- 20 "SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of [\$25,000,000]

1	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscar
2	year $[\frac{2022-2023}{2023-2024}]$ to be deposited into the Hawaii
3	retirement savings special fund.
4	There is appropriated out of the Hawaii retirement savings
5	special fund the sum of [\$25,000,000] \$ or so much
6	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year [2022-2023] 2023-
7	2024 for the State to make matching contributions of up to \$500
8	to the accounts of the first 50,000 covered employees who
9	participate in the Hawaii retirement savings program for twelve
10	consecutive months after initial enrollment."
11	PART VI
12	SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
15	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
16	year 2024-2025 to establish:
17	(1) One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) temporary federal
18	funds advisor position; and
19	(2) Two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) temporary senior

1	liaisons and state-federal affairs representatives in
2	Hawaii and the District of Columbia.
3	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
4	the governor for the purposes of this Act.
