A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC PARKING AT ALA WAI BOAT HARBOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Ala Wai boat 2 harbor serves as a melting pot of culture and activity in the 3 community. Its ocean legacy is an asset to cultural and 4 recreational practices and water sport opportunities, such as surfing, paddling, fishing, and Hawaii's voyaging traditions. 5 For many keiki, the Ala Wai boat harbor is their first 6 7 introduction to canoe paddling, surfing, sailing, boating, and 8 other water activities.

9 The department of land and natural resources, through its 10 division of boating and ocean recreation, operates and manages 11 the Ala Wai boat harbor, Kahanamoku lagoon, and the adjacent parking areas. In 2008, the board of land and natural resources 12 13 approved the parking plan for the Ala Wai boat harbor, which 14 includes nine hundred forty-one parking stalls, three hundred 15 twelve of which are permit stalls. The board of land and 16 natural resources reduced the number of free parking stalls from

five hundred forty-nine to three hundred by converting free
stalls to paid metered stalls.

Due to immense public opposition to this reduction in the number of free parking stalls, the approved plan requires that no fewer than three hundred free parking stalls be set aside. The division of boating and ocean recreation's current request for proposals states that the parking plan is subject to change depending on the type and configuration of the new development project for the Ala Wai boat harbor.

10 The legislature further finds that the removal of free 11 public parking would adversely restrict access to Hawaii's 12 natural resources for use by the community as the cost of living 13 already puts a tremendous strain on Hawaii's residents and 14 families. Beyond the addition of fees, there are also the 15 burdens of transporting beach equipment from the proposed 16 parking structure and safety consequences for surfers. Without 17 free parking at Ala Wai boat harbor, surfers are likely to park 18 at Ala Moana beach park and paddle across the active boat harbor 19 entrance, thus endangering themselves as well as ocean craft.

20 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to ensure access to21 the ocean for future generations and protect surfers' rights to

1 enter the ocean safely and safequard access to the lagoon, 2 beach, and harbor waters named after Duke Kahanamoku by 3 requiring the maintenance of three hundred parking stalls at Ala 4 Wai boat harbor at no cost for recreational ocean access and for 5 the practice of traditional and customary Native Hawaiian 6 rights. 7 SECTION 2. Section 200-2.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 8 9 "[+] §200-2.6[+] Ala Wai boat harbor; leases. (a) The 10 fast lands and submerged lands of the Ala Wai boat harbor that may be leased include the following: 11 All fast lands and submerged lands described in the 12 (1)13 request for qualifications or request for proposals 14 issued by the division of boating and ocean recreation 15 of the department on November 25, 2008; 16 (2) The fast land described as a portion of tax map key: (1) 2-3-37-12, composed of approximately 112,580 17 18 square feet, presently used for harbor offices and 19 permitted vehicular parking; and 20 (3) The fast land described as a portion of tax map key: (1) 2-3-37-12, which is a triangular area located 21
