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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADVANCING CIVIC ENGAGEMENT.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The legislature finds that civic engagement  
2 provides an opportunity for residents to become involved with  
3 improving their local communities and neighborhoods. In 2021,  
4 the supreme court enacted Rule 23 to establish the commission to  
5 promote and advance civic education (PACE commission). One of  
6 the main functions of the PACE commission is to provide  
7 leadership, oversight, and initiatives to increase civic  
8 education in the community and at schools, increase citizens'  
9 knowledge about government, and promote informed participation  
10 in government and democracy in the State.

11           The legislature further finds that the public access room,  
12 an office under the legislative reference bureau, provides the  
13 public with information, equipment, facilities, and services to  
14 assist in research activities, educational outreach, and public  
15 engagement related to work with the legislature. The  
16 legislature additionally finds that the public access room is  
17 well-positioned to further civic engagement between the



1 legislature and students in the State through educational  
2 partnerships such as the Hawaii P-20 partnerships for education.  
3 However, the public access room currently lacks resources to  
4 provide outreach services beyond its current efforts.

5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the  
6 public access room to establish and maintain an outreach and  
7 engagement program for primary, secondary, post-secondary, and  
8 community education and provide funding for one full-time  
9 equivalent (1.0 FTE) position to assist in effectuating this  
10 requirement.

11 SECTION 2. Section 21G-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
12 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

13 "(a) There is established in the state capitol a public  
14 access room in which members of the public shall be allowed to  
15 utilize various equipment, services, and facilities to enhance  
16 their ability to participate in the legislative process. As  
17 part of its duties, the public access room shall establish and  
18 maintain an outreach and engagement program for primary,  
19 secondary, post-secondary, and community education."

20 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general  
21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so



1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and  
2 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal  
3 year 2024-2025 to establish one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE)  
4 position within the public access room.


5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the legislative  
6 reference bureau for the purposes of this Act.

7 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
