### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that title I, part A, of
the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended
by the Every Student Succeeds Act (Title I), provides federal
financial assistance to local educational agencies and schools
with high percentages of children from low-income families to
help ensure educational success.

7 To assist in identifying methods of relieving the financial 8 burden of education on low-income families, Act 142, Session 9 Laws of Hawaii 2022, was enacted to establish a school supply 10 subsidy pilot program within the department of education to 11 subsidize school supplies at schools composed entirely of 12 students eligible for participation in Title I. The school 13 supply subsidy pilot program was established as a one-year pilot 14 program to be operated only for the 2022-2023 school year. The 15 legislature believes the value in the pilot program necessitates 16 the extension of the pilot program for two additional years.
