A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEAT DONATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a need for an increased protein donation capacity to feed our local underresourced population. Existing law specifically prohibits the inclusion of meat as a donation; however, wild game can be a significant source of protein. The inclusion of wild game as a donation-eligible food resource creates a beneficial outlet for food-safe meat harvested from invasive species.

8 The legislature also finds that Wisconsin, Michigan, and 9 Utah offer meat donation programs that can serve as models that 10 Hawaii can assess to develop tools for long term, sustainable, 11 management programs for invasive species. For example, Utah 12 amended their Good Samaritan law to enable the harvest of white 13 tail deer meat for donation to charities and provided an 14 exception to antemortem inspection if certain requirements and 15 conditions are met.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to amend theconditions for donations to allow provision of this important

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protein source to under-resourced communities, including the
 homeless.

3	SECT	ION 2. Section 145D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended b	y amending subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:
5	"(d)	The exceptions to liability specified in subsection
6	(a) shall	include:
7	(1)	The donation of perishable or nonperishable food that
8		has exceeded the labeled shelf life date recommended
9		by the manufacturer; [and]
10	(2)	The donation of farm produce; provided that the good-
11		faith donor or distributor reasonably believes that
12		the food is fit for human consumption $[-]$; and
13	(3)	The donation of livestock or wild game meat; provided
14		that the good-faith donor harvested the meat in a food
15		safe manner, processed the meat in accordance with
16		section 159-25 and the distributor reasonably believes
17		that the food is fit for human consumption.
18	(e)	For the purposes of this section:
19	"Don	or" means any individual, food vendor, food
20	manufactu	rer, food distributor, grocery or convenience store,

21 charitable or nonprofit organization, <u>butcher</u>, <u>meat processor</u>,

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or government agency that donates food to needy persons where
 the food in question has been prepared and packaged in a
 facility meeting all relevant food safety guidelines,
 certifications, and requirements and has passed all food safety
 inspections.

6 "Farm produce" means all agricultural, horticultural, and 7 vegetable produce of the soil, but does not include poultry, 8 poultry products, livestock and livestock products, aquaculture 9 and aquaculture products, and timber or timber products."

10 SECTION 3. (a) There is established a meat processing 11 task force to develop and implement a plan to expand the meat 12 processing capacity in the State to allow for meat from axis 13 deer and other wild game to be processed for distribution by 14 nonprofit food distribution services. The meat processing task 15 force shall be composed of the following members:

16 (1) The chairperson of the board of agriculture; or the
17 chairperson's designee;

18 (2) One member from the department of health, selected by19 the director of health;



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1	(3)	One member from the department of business, economic
2		development, and tourism, selected by the director of
3		business, economic development, and tourism;
4	(4)	The administrator of the division of forestry and
5		wildlife within the department of land and natural
6		resources or the administrator's designee;
7	(5)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
8		resources or the chairperson's designee;
9	(6)	One member from the Environmental Protection Agency
10		who shall be invited by the co-chairs;
11	(7)	Four members, one each to be appointed by the
12		respective mayors of the city and county of Honolulu,
13		and the counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui; and
14	(8)	Four members to be jointly selected and invited to
15		participate by the president of the senate and the
16		speaker of the house of representatives, of which two
17		members shall be selected from an environmental
18		nonprofit organization, and two members shall be
19		selected from an agricultural or ranching association.

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1	Task force members may recommend to the task force		
2	additional members with appropriate specialized expertise,		
3	subject to approval by the chairperson.		
4	(b) The task force shall create a master plan to expand		
5	the meat processing capacity in the State to allow for meat from		
6	axis deer and other wild game to be processed for distribution		
7	by nonprofit food distribution services.		
8	(c) The task force shall submit a report of its findings		
9	and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the		
10	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of		
11	the regular session of 2024.		
12	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general		
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and		
15	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
16	year 2024-2025 for the meat processing task force to develop and		
17	implement a masterplan to expand meat processing capacity in the		
18	State to allow for wild game to be distributed by nonprofit food		
19	distributors.		
20	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department		
21	of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.		

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SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
