RELATING TO TRESPASS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§708-</u> Enforcement of trespass laws on public land.
5	When trespass involves public land, any state or county law
6	enforcement officer may enforce the trespass laws of this part
7	without regard to whether the land is owned by the State or by a
8	county; provided that nothing in this section shall be construed
9	to alter the existing responsibility of law enforcement officers
10	to enforce, as applicable, the laws of the State, or to alter
11	the respective jurisdictional boundaries observed by state and
12	county law enforcement officers. Nothing contained in this
13	section shall diminish, alter, or amend any existing rights,
14	privileges, or practices of the Native Hawaiian people; nor
15	shall the obligations of the State to the Native Hawaiian people
16	be absolved."
