A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECORDINGS OF PUBLIC MEETINGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the house of
- 2 representatives adopted House Resolution No. 9, Regular Session
- 3 of 2022, to establish the commission to improve standards of
- 4 conduct. The resolution requests that the commission ensure
- 5 state laws and rules relating to standards of conduct of public
- 6 officers and employees contain clear standards, enforcement, and
- 7 penalties and provide recommendations to increase awareness of,
- 8 compliance with, and deterrent effects of the code of ethics,
- 9 lobbying laws, campaign finance laws, and other relevant laws
- 10 and rules.
- 11 Pursuant to House Resolution No. 9, the commission to
- 12 improve standards of conduct convened regularly throughout 2022
- 13 to diligently review, discuss, and consider the issues
- 14 presented; submit an interim report to the house of
- 15 representatives outlining areas of immediate and long-term
- 16 focus; receive input from the public and invited individuals and

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- 1 agencies; and issue a final report with various recommendations
- 2 and accompanying proposed legislation.
- 3 The legislature also finds that the strength and stability
- 4 of our democratic government rely upon the public's trust in
- 5 government institutions, including the expectation that officers
- 6 act ethically with prudence, integrity, and sound judgement.
- 7 Therefore, an essential goal of the commission was to provide
- 8 recommendations that would help restore public trust in state
- 9 government and increase the level of transparency in its
- 10 operations and accountability of individuals.
- 11 The legislature additionally finds that opening the
- 12 governmental process to public scrutiny and participation is
- 13 necessary to protect the public's interests. Specifically,
- 14 opening up discussions, deliberations, decisions, and actions of
- 15 governmental agencies that are forming and implementing public
- 16 policy should be facilitated as much as possible.
- 17 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to implement
- 18 recommendations of the commission to improve standards of
- 19 conduct relating to public agency meetings by:
- 20 (1) Encouraging boards to maintain any recording of a
- 21 board meeting as a public record on the board's

1		website regardless of whether the written minutes of
2		the meeting have been posted;
3	(2)	Requiring boards to provide the state archives with a
4		copy of any recording of a board meeting before
5		removing the recording from the board's website; and
6	(3)	Requiring the written minutes of board meetings to
7		include a link to the electronic audio or video
8		recording of the meeting, if available.
9	SECT	ION 2. Section 92-3.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
11	"(b)	For a remote meeting held by interactive conference
12	technolog	y pursuant to this section:
13	(1)	The interactive conference technology used by the
14		board shall allow interaction among all members of the
15		board participating in the meeting and all members of
16		the public attending the meeting;
17	(2)	Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d), a
18		quorum of board members participating in the meeting
19		shall be visible and audible to other members and the
20		public during the meeting; provided that no other

1		meeting participants shall be required to be visible
2	•	during the meeting;
3	(3)	Any board member participating in a meeting by
4		interactive conference technology shall be considered
5	•	present at the meeting for the purpose of determining
6		compliance with the quorum and voting requirements of
7		the board;
8	(4)	At the start of the meeting the presiding officer
9		shall announce the names of the participating members;
10	(5)	All votes shall be conducted by roll call unless
11	•	unanimous; and
12	(6)	[When practicable, Except for licensing boards under
13		section 26-9, boards shall record meetings open to the
14		public, when practicable, and make the recording of
15		any meeting electronically available to the public as
16		soon as practicable after a meeting and until a time
17		as the minutes required by section 92-9 are
18		electronically posted on the board's website. <u>Boards</u>
19		are encouraged to keep recordings available on their
20		website."

1	SECT	ION 3. Section 92-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a)	The board shall keep written or recorded minutes of
4	all meeti	ngs. Unless otherwise required by law, neither a full
5	transcrip	t nor a recording of the meeting is required, but the
6	minutes s	hall give a true reflection of the matters discussed at
7	the meeti	ng and the views of the participants. Before the
8	removal o	f a recording that was maintained on a board's website
9	pursuant	to section 92-3.7(b)(6), the board shall provide the
10	state archives with a copy of the recording. Written minutes	
11	shall inc	lude[, but need not be limited to:] at minimum:
12	(1)	The date, time, and place of the meeting;
13	(2)	The members of the board recorded as either present or
14		absent;
15	(3)	The substance of all matters proposed, discussed, or
16	•	decided; and a record, by individual member, of any
17		votes taken; [and]
18	(4)	If an electronic audio or video recording of the
19		meeting is available online, a link to the electronic
20		audio or video recording of the meeting, to be placed
21		at the beginning of the minutes, and

1	$\left[\frac{(4)}{(5)}\right]$ Any other information that any member of the
2	board requests be included or reflected in the
3	minutes."
4	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on October 1, 2023.

Report Title:

Commission to Improve Standards of Conduct; Recordings of Public Meetings; Meeting Minutes; Public Record; Boards

Description:

Exempts licensing boards under DCCA from the requirement that board meetings be recorded. Encourages boards to maintain recordings of board meetings on the board's website regardless of whether the written minutes of the meeting have been posted. Requires boards to provide the state archives with a copy of any recording of a board meeting before removing the recording from the board's website. Requires the written minutes of board meetings to include a link to the electronic audio or video recording, if available online. Effective 10/1/2023. (HD1)

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
