BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

4	" <u>§45</u> 3	3- Traveling team physicians; exemption. (a) A			
5	physician	licensed and in good standing to practice as a			
6	physician	in another state shall be exempt from the licensure			
7	requiremen	nts of this chapter if:			
8	(1)	The physician has a written or oral agreement with a			
9		sports team to provide care to team members and			
10		coaching staff traveling with the team for a specific			
11		sporting event to take place in the State; or			
12	(2)	The physician has been invited by a national sport			
13		governing body to provide services to team members and			
14		coaching staff at a national sport training center in			
15		the State or to provide services at an event or			
16		competition in the State that is sanctioned by the			
17		national sport governing body; provided that:			

i		(A)	The physician's practice is limited to that
2			required by the national sport governing body;
3		<u>(B)</u>	The services provided by the physician are within
4			the physician's scope of practice; and
5		<u>(C)</u>	The physician has notified the Hawaii medical
6			board of the date the physician intends to enter
7			and practice in the State before the physician
8			enters the State.
9	(b)	Noth	ing in this section shall be construed to permit a
10	physician	exem	pted by this section to:
11	(1)	Prov	ide care or consultation to any person residing in
12		the	State, other than a person specified in subsection

16	(c)	An e	xemption obtained pursuant to subsection (a)(1)
17	shall be	valid	while the physician is traveling with the sports
18	team, but	no l	onger than ten days per individual sporting event.
19	(d)	Upon	application to the Hawaii medical board and for
20	good caus	e sho	wn, the Hawaii medical board may increase the time
21	period in	subs	ection (c) by a maximum of twenty days per

- 2 more than thirty additional days in a calendar year.
- 3 (e) An exemption pursuant to subsection (a) (2) shall be
- 4 valid during the time certified by the national sport governing
- 5 body; provided that no exemption shall be valid for more than

- 7 (f) The Hawaii medical board may enter into agreements
- 8 with medical and osteopathic licensing boards of other states to
- 9 implement this section. Agreements may include procedures for
- 10 reporting potential medical license violations.
- 11 (g) The Hawaii medical board shall adopt rules pursuant to
- 12 chapter 91 for purposes of this section."
