## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TELEHEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that telehealth has 2 served as a lifeline of access to essential health care services 3 for residents with adequate broadband coverage. However, many residents that live in rural and underprivileged communities are 4 5 often cut off from receiving essential health care through 6 telehealth because they lack the broadband coverage necessary to 7 access this care. As a result, many of these residents will put 8 off receiving care until the point of requiring emergency room 9 admission, which in turn adds strain to a system already 10 experiencing resource and staffing shortages.

11 The legislature further finds that the use of standard 12 telephone contact in telehealth during the COVID-19 pandemic 13 demonstrated the effectiveness of this tool as a mode of 14 essential health care delivery, especially for residents living 15 in rural, isolated, and underprivileged communities. For kupuna 16 and others who may have limited digital literacy, the ability to

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1 use a landline telephone to receive care was a lifeline resource 2 during the pandemic. 3 The purpose of this Act is to authorize reimbursement 4 services provided through telehealth by way of an interactive 5 telecommunications system. 6 SECTION 2. Section 346-59.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended as follows: 8 1. By amending subsection (b) to read: 9 "(b) Reimbursement for services provided through 10 telehealth by way of an interactive telecommunications system 11 shall be equivalent to reimbursement for the same services 12 provided via face-to-face contact between a health care provider 13 and a patient. Nothing in this section shall require a health 14 care provider to be physically present with the patient at an 15 originating site unless a health care provider at the distant site deems it necessary." 16 17 2. By amending subsection (g) to read: 18 "(q) For the purposes of this section: 19 "Distant site" means the location of the health care 20 provider delivering services through telehealth at the time the 21 services are provided.

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1 at the time services are provided by a health care provider 2 through telehealth, including but not limited to a health care 3 provider's office, hospital, critical access hospital, rural 4 health clinic, federally qualified health center, a patient's 5 home, and other non-medical environments such as school-based 6 health centers, university-based health centers, or the work 7 location of a patient.

8 "Telehealth" means the use of telecommunications services, 9 as defined in section 269-1, to encompass four modalities: 10 store and forward technologies, remote monitoring, live 11 consultation, and mobile health; and which shall include but not 12 be limited to real-time video conferencing-based communication, 13 secure interactive and non-interactive web-based communication, 14 and secure asynchronous information exchange, to transmit 15 patient medical information, including diagnostic-quality 16 digital images and laboratory results for medical interpretation 17 and diagnosis, for the purpose of delivering enhanced health 18 care services and information while a patient is at an 19 originating site and the health care provider is at a distant 20 site. [Standard] Except as otherwise provided for in this 21 section, standard telephone contacts, facsimile transmissions,

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or [e-mail] electronic mail text, in combination or by itself, 1 2 does not constitute a telehealth service [for the purposes of 3 this section]." 4 SECTION 3. Section 431:10A-116.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 5 is amended as follows: 6 1. 13	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
