HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO REVIEW AND UPDATE THE RELEVANT CHAPTERS OF THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES THAT RELATE TO MENTAL HEALTH AND INVOLUNTARY TRANSPORT, EXAMINATION, HOSPITALIZATION, AND TREATMENT, INCLUDING ASSISTED COMMUNITY TREATMENT.

WHEREAS, the chapters of the Hawaii Revised Statutes 1 relating to mental health and involuntary transport, 2 examination, hospitalization, and treatment have been amended in 3 a piecemeal manner over the past several decades, which has led 4 to some lack in clarity and inconsistencies; and 5 6 WHEREAS, periodically reviewing the Hawaii Revised Statutes 7 would be helpful to advance the overall goal of improving mental 8 9 health, including for those unable to help themselves; now, therefore, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 12 13 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 14 15 Health is requested to convene a working group to review and update the relevant chapters of the Hawaii Revised Statutes that 16 relate to mental health and involuntary transport, examination, 17 18 hospitalization, and treatment, including assisted community treatment; and 19 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested make recommendations for statutory revisions that focus on those 22 chapters relevant to mental health-related voluntary assessment, 23 care, and treatment; and 24 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to include the following members: 27 28

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, upon request of the working group, the Department of Health is requested to assist in the preparation of the report; provided that before August 1, 2023, the working group submits a draft to the Legislative Reference Bureau, including any information and materials deemed necessary by the Legislative Reference Bureau, for the preparation of the final report; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group, with the 10 assistance of the Department of Health, is requested to submit a 11 report of its findings and recommendations, including any 12 proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty 13 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and 14
