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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT OF PROPOSED MANDATORY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR WEIGHT MANAGEMENT MEDICATION.

WHEREAS, the National Institutes of Health has reported 1 that obesity and being overweight are now the second leading 2 cause of death nationally, with an estimated three hundred 3 thousand deaths a year attributed to the epidemic; and 4 5 WHEREAS, obesity increases the risk for chronic diseases 6 and conditions, including high blood pressure, heart disease, 7 certain cancers, arthritis, mental illness, lipid disorders, 8 9 sleep apnea, and type 2 diabetes; and 10 WHEREAS, clinicians increasingly recognize that obesity is 11 12 closely linked to genetics and environmental factors; and 13 WHEREAS, more than half of Medicare beneficiaries are 14 treated for five or more chronic conditions per year; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the rate of obesity among Medicare beneficiaries 17 doubled from 1987 to 2002 and nearly doubled again by 2016, with 18 Medicare spending on individuals with obesity during that time 19 rising proportionately to reach \$50 billion in 2014; and 20 21 WHEREAS, on average, a Medicare beneficiary with obesity 22 costs \$2,018 more than a healthy-weight beneficiary; and 23 24 WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires 25 that "[b] efore any legislative measure that mandates health 26 insurance coverage for specific health services, specific 27 diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part 28 of individual or group health insurance policies, can be 29 considered, there shall be concurrent resolutions passed 30 requesting the auditor to prepare and submit to the legislature 31



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1 a report that assesses both the social and financial effects of 2 the proposed mandated coverage"; and 3 WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, further 4 5 provides that "[t]he concurrent resolutions shall designate a specific legislative bill that: 6 7 (1) Has been introduced in the legislature; and 8 9 (2) Includes, at a minimum, information identifying the: 10 11 (A) Specific health service, disease, or provider 12 that would be covered; 13 14 (B) Extent of the coverage; 15 16 17 (C) Target groups that would be covered; 18 19 (D) Limitations on utilization, if any; and 20 (E) Standards of care. 21 22 23 For purposes of this part, mandated health insurance coverage shall not include mandated optionals."; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, section 23-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, further 27 specifies the minimum information required for assessing the social and financial impact of the proposed health coverage 28 29 mandate in the Auditor's report; and 30 WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 31 , introduced in the Regular 32 Session of 2023, proposes to expand existing health insurance mandates to cover weight management medication for persons who 33 34 are obese or overweight with one or more related comorbidities; now, therefore, 35 36 37 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 38 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is 39 40 requested to conduct an impact assessment report in accordance with sections 23-51 and 23-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, of 41 42 mandating health insurance coverage for weight management

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medication as proposed in Senate Bill No. , introduced in 1 the Regular Session of 2023; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is further 4 requested to include in its assessment the impact of section 5 1311(d)(3) of the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care 6 Act (PPACA) on Senate Bill No. , or similar legislation that 7 includes but is not limited to the additional cost of any 8 9 benefits beyond the essential health benefits of Hawaii's qualified health plans under the PPACA; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is also requested 12 to determine how many qualified health plans are available in 13 Hawaii, including plans offered by health maintenance 14 organizations; the individual or group enrollment in these 15 plans; and the actuarial cost of the defrayment to the State for 16 17 the reimbursement of weight management medication; and 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 19 submit a report on its findings and recommendations, including 20 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 21 22 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor and 26 Insurance Commissioner, who is requested to transmit copies to 27 each insurer in the State that issues health insurance policies. 28 29 30 OFFERED BY: 31 BIR
