HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO ADOPT NATIONAL CARBON FEE AND DIVIDEND LEGISLATION.

1 WHEREAS, United Nations Secretary General Antonio Guterres 2 recently said, "Greenhouse gas emissions keep growing, global 3 temperatures keep rising, and our planet is fast approaching 4 tipping points that will make climate chaos irreversible. We 5 are on a highway to climate hell with our foot on the 6 accelerator"; and

8 WHEREAS, carbon dioxide is a major greenhouse gas and its 9 concentration in the atmosphere has been increasing at 10 progressively rapid rate for more than sixty years, as shown by 11 measurements taken at observatories on Mauna Loa and Mauna Kea, 12 and now registers at more than four hundred twenty parts per 13 million, which is fifty percent higher than before the 14 Industrial Revolution; and

16 WHEREAS, many climate change impacts are anticipated for 17 the Hawaiian Islands, including increases in ocean and air 18 temperatures, sea level rise, droughts, severe weather patterns, 19 ocean acidification, and more frequent and severe wildfires; and 20

21 WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change 22 stated in the most recent report of its mitigation working group 23 that any pathway to limit warming to two degrees Celsius would 24 have to "involve rapid and deep and in most cases immediate 25 greenhouse gas emissions reductions in all sectors"; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the United States needs powerful new policies to

28 meet its greenhouse gas emission reduction goals established in
29 the 2015 Paris Climate Agreement; and

31 WHEREAS, imposing a tax on the burning of fossil fuels and 32 returning the revenues to households to spend as they see fit, a 33 carbon-pricing policy commonly known as carbon fee and dividend,



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1 is an effective and equitable way to substantially reduce 2 greenhouse gas emissions; and

WHEREAS, carbon fee and dividend is supported by more than 4 thirty-six hundred economists, including twenty-eight Nobel 5 Laureates and fifteen former chairs of the Council of Economic 6 7 Advisers, who signed a statement that begins, "A carbon tax offers the most cost-effective lever to reduce carbon emissions 8 at the scale and speed that is necessary" and the statement 9 continues, "to maximize the fairness and political viability of 10 a rising tax, all the revenue should be returned directly to 11 American citizens through equal lump-sum rebates"; and 12 13

14 WHEREAS, a national carbon fee and dividend program can 15 include border adjustments, such as carbon-content-based tariffs 16 on products imported from countries without comparable carbon 17 pricing and refunds to our exporters of carbon taxes paid, to 18 maintain the competitiveness of United States businesses in 19 global markets; and

21 WHEREAS, major trading partners of the United States like 22 Canada and the European Union have adopted meaningful carbon 23 taxes and are now considering carbon border adjustments to level 24 the playing field by ensuring that imports are subject to the 25 same carbon pricing as local goods; and

WHEREAS, a national carbon fee and dividend program can be implemented quickly and efficiently; and respond to the urgency of the climate crises, because the federal government already has in place mechanisms, such as the Internal Revenue Service, needed to implement and enforce the tax, and already collects taxes from fossil fuel producers and importers; and

WHEREAS, a national carbon fee and dividend program would make the United States a leader in mitigating climate change and the advancing of clean energy technologies in the 21st century, and would incentivize other countries to enact similar carbon pricing policies, thereby reducing global greenhouse gas emissions without the need for complex international agreements; now, therefore,



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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the United States
 Congress is urged to pass national carbon fee and dividend
 legislation; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 8 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President and Vice-9 President of the United States, Speaker of the United States 10 House of Representatives, Majority Leader of the United States 11 Senate, and members of Hawaii's congressional delegation.
