HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO STRENGTHEN THE CENTER FOR LABOR EDUCATION AND RESEARCH AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII WEST OAHU BY ESTABLISHING A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP A COMMUNITY-DRIVEN VISION FOR THE CENTERS PROGRAMS.

1	WHEREAS, the Center for Labor Education and Research					
2	(Center) was first established by Act 202, Session Laws of					
3	Hawaii 1976 (Act 202), to address the need for specialized					
4	education and training by workers and trade union leaders to					
5	improve their professional competence and ability to effectively					
6	administer their affairs; and

8	WHEREAS, Act 75, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, subsequently					
9	revamped the higher education statutes and the Center was					
10	recodified under chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, with					
11	similar goals and responsibilities to the original intent of Act					

202; and

WHEREAS, existing law requires the Center to:

- (1) Provide credit and noncredit labor studies courses and labor-related research and educational services for workers and their organizations;

(2) Provide labor-related education to the public;

- 22 (3) Advise and assist in the development and
 23 implementation of labor-related instructional
 24 programs, courses, and activities for use within the
 25 Department of Education, including teacher
 26 preparation;
 - (4) Develop and implement a labor studies degree program or programs in the University of Hawaii System; and



1 Serve as the clearinghouse for labor education matters 2 (5) in the State; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Center is now located on the second floor of 5 the James and Abigail Campbell Library at the University of 6 Hawaii West Oahu; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, the nationally-recognized faculty at the Center, including its Director, have struggled to meet the goals and 10 purposes of Act 202, due to diminishing resources and support; 11 and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, the State has the highest union membership rates of any state in the nation; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii invests a considerable 17 number of resources in degree-granting programs to provide 18 19 advanced degrees to employers and human resource managers and business administrators; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii Board of Regents has only 22 recently approved a Labor Studies Certificate program at the 23 24 University of Hawaii West Oahu for those interested in pursuing 25 an academic labor studies program; and 26 WHEREAS, the Center's Labor History Archive won the 2016 27 Reference and User Services Association's John Sessions Memorial 28 Award, which recognizes a library or library system that has 29 30 made a significant effort to work with the labor community and by doing so has brought recognition to the history and 31 contribution of the labor movement to the development of the 32 United States; and 33 34 WHEREAS, the Labor Education Advisory Council advises the 35 Chancellor of the University of Hawaii West Oahu on all 36 37 activities and programs of the Center and has repeatedly advised the Chancellor of the importance of the Center's purposes, 38 39 functions, and needs of the labor unions the Advisory Council 40 represents; and 41



WHEREAS, knowledge and understanding of the laws governing 1 2 labor organizations and the unique labor history of the State are more important than ever to improve the professional 3 competence of labor union representatives, so that these 4 representatives can better administer their affairs, and 5 intervene wisely to effectively shape the environments at their 6 jobs, in their unions, and in the community; now, therefore, 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 9 10 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the University of 11 Hawaii is urged to strengthen the Center for Labor Education and 12 Research at the University of Hawaii West Oahu by establishing a 13 working group to develop a community-driven vision for the 14 15 Center's programs; and 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group be comprised 17 18 of the following members: 19 20 (1)The President of the University of Hawaii System, or the President's designee; 21 22 23 (2) One member of the Labor Education Advisory Council, to be appointed by the Chancellor of the University of 24 Hawaii West Oahu; 25 26 The Director of Labor and Industrial Relations, or the 27 (3) 28 Director's designee; 29 (4) One member of the House of Representatives, to be 30 appointed by the Speaker of the House of 31 32 Representative; 33 34 (5) One member of the Senate, to be appointed by the President of the Senate; and 35 36 Two members of the labor community, to be appointed by 37 (6) the President of the University of Hawaii; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 40 to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, 41 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later 42



1 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 2 of 2024; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Labor and Industrial Relations, President of the University of Hawaii System, Chancellor of the University of Hawaii West Oahu, Director of the Center for Labor Education and Research, and members of the Labor Education Advisory Council.
