HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THE NUMBER OF PUBLIC SCHOOL PLAYGROUNDS THAT INCLUDE PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT ACCESSIBLE TO STUDENTS WITH PHYSICAL, INTELLECTUAL, OR DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES.

1 2	WHEREAS, playgrounds provide students with opportunities to socialize and engage in physical activity; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, playgrounds benefit child development in a variety
5	of ways beyond physical wellness, such as expanding social,
6	emotional, and imaginative skills; increasing confidence;
7	improving coordination; and advancing critical thinking and
8	problem-solving capabilities; and
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10	WHEREAS, however, traditional playground equipment is often
11	inaccessible to children with disabilities, which deprives
12	children with disabilities of the same benefits their peers
13	without disabilities enjoy; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, there are numerous benefits of accessible and
16	inclusive playgrounds, including providing recreation for
17	students with disabilities, enabling them to socialize and make
18	new friends, and help their peers without disabilities learn to
19	understand differences; and

21	WHEREAS, in December 2022, the Department of Education
22	announced an \$18,000,000 partnership with a nonprofit to improve
23	and replace public school playground equipment across the State;
24	and reprise public concer playground equipment derost the state, and
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23 26	WHEREAS, as part of this initiative, the Department is
27	aiming to repair, replace, or add approximately one hundred
28	playgrounds across the State; and
20 29	prargroundo across the state, and

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WHEREAS, creating an inclusive playground environment for 1 all children in the State's public schools is critical to 2 ensuring all students get a chance to benefit from unstructured 3 play; and 4 5 WHEREAS, identifying how many playgrounds across the 6 7 Department's public schools and charter school are accessible to students with physical, intellectual, or developmental 8 9 disabilities is an important first step toward this goal; now, therefore, 10 11 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 13 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 14 15 Education is requested to report to the Legislature on the number of public school playgrounds that include playground 16 equipment accessible to students with physical, intellectual, or 17 18 developmental disabilities; and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report is requested to 20 21 include: 22 23 (1)The name and location of each public school whose 24 playground includes accessible playground equipment; 25 26 (2) The name and location of each public school that has been identified as part of the Department of 27 Education's initiative to repair, replace, or add 28 29 playgrounds; and 30 31 (3) Any opportunities to construct new accessible 32 playground equipment or convert existing playground 33 equipment as part of this initiative; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 36 requested to submit its report to the Legislature no later than 37 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 38 2025; and 39 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 41 Board of Education and Superintendent of Education. 42
