HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE MAYORS AND COUNCILS OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, COUNTY OF MAUI, COUNTY OF HAWAII, AND COUNTY OF KAUAI TO ESTABLISH BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS, business improvement districts are economic 1 2 development organizations that bring public services to certain 3 neighborhoods to provide governmental public services; and 4 5 WHEREAS, business improvement districts are approved by state legislation and funded by assessment fees paid by 6 7 merchants and property owners within the district; and 8 9 WHEREAS, business improvement districts are managed by 10 public or nonprofit boards, predominantly with local business representation, but also commonly include representation from 11 area residents and local governments; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, business improvement districts create collective economic benefits for their members that cannot be achieved on 15 an individual basis, including providing sanitation, enhanced 16 17 security, capital improvements, neighborhood promotions, and business attraction, such as leading marketing campaigns to 18 19 attract commercial tenants, customers, tourists, and investors; 20 and 21 WHEREAS, successful business improvement districts occurs 22 23 when services match the needs of the people in that district, which can only be used to fund local improvements that provide 24 25 benefits within the designated district; and 26 27 WHEREAS, Act 107, Session Laws of Hawaii 1999, codified as 28 section 46-80.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, authorizes the 29 counties to create special improvement districts for the

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purposes of providing, financing, and coordinating federal, 1 2 state, and county efforts to engage in: 3 Supplemental maintenance and security services; 4 (1)5 (2)Environmental research, restoration, and maintenance; 6 7 8 (3) Natural resource management; 9 10 (4) Natural hazard mitigation; 11 12 (5) Climate change and sea level rise adaptation; and 13 14 (6) Other improvements, services, and facilities within 15 the special improvement districts that will improve 16 environmental conditions, provide community benefits, and restore or promote business activity in the 17 special improvement districts and the making and 18 19 financing of improvements within those districts; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the State has business improvement districts in 22 Chinatown, Fort Street Mall, and Waikiki on Oahu; Hilo, Hawaii; and Kailua-Kona, Hawaii; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, the Chinatown Improvement District has been 26 operating since 2010 and works to improve conditions in the 27 greater Chinatown area and encourage and promote the 28 preservation and enhancement of the ethnic, cultural, and 29 historical character and significance of Chinatown; and 30 31 WHEREAS, the Waikiki Business Improvement District was 32 authorized and established in 2000 and is managed by the Waikiki 33 Business Improvement District Association, which works in 34 partnership with business and government to develop and implement programs that will strengthen the physical and 35 36 economic vitality of Waikiki and help maintain its position as a 37 world class resort designation; and 38 39 WHEREAS, the Fort Street Mall Business Improvement District 40 was signed into law in 2002 and was patterned after the Waikiki 41 Business Improvement District; and 42

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1 WHEREAS, the Hilo Downtown Improvement Association was 2 founded more than forty years ago to revitalize and reestablish 3 historic downtown Hilo as the social, cultural and commercial 4 center of East Hawaii and works with its founding partners and 5 the County of Hawaii to protect, preserve, and create a vibrant downtown Hilo enjoyable for all; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the Kailua Village Business Improvement District 9 was established in 2007 with a mission to make Historic Kailua 10 Village a sustainable model for a community that is a better 11 place to invest, work, live, and play; and 12 13 WHEREAS, business improvement districts help improve 14 services that are provided by the municipality and increase the 15 quality and efficiency of outcomes usually required of 16 businesses, and can have a significant positive impact on 17 commercial property values; and 18 19 WHEREAS, establishing more business improvement districts 20 throughout Hawaii can increase the vitality and attractiveness 21 of communities in the State; now, therefore, 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 24 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Mayors and 25 26 Councils of the City and County of Honolulu, County of Maui, 27 County of Hawaii, and County of Kauai are urged to establish business improvement districts within their respective counties; 28 29 and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 32 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, Mayor of the County of Maui, Mayor of 33 the County of Hawaii, Mayor of the County of Kauai, Chairperson 34 of the Honolulu City Council, Chairperson of the Maui County 35 36 Council, Chairperson of the Hawaii County Council, and Chairperson of the Kauai County Council. 37 38 OFFERED BY: Thick la Chica 39 40

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
