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WHEREAS, this number represents 18 percent of the total 1 2 number of 2,355 individuals on Oahu who were experiencing unsheltered homelessness on March 9, 2022, which is the third-3 highest percentage on Oahu, surpassed only by Region 1 (26 4 percent, or 622 individuals) and Region 2 (24 percent, or 575 5 individuals); and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, in Region 7, 57 percent, or 82, of surveyed adults were chronically homeless individuals; and 9 10 WHEREAS, it is important to ensure that the Homeless 11 Programs Office, which is part of the Department of Human 12 Services, allocates adequate funding for each region of Oahu for 13 homeless services; now, therefore, 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 16 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 17 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 18 Human Services is requested to perform a study on the Homeless 19 Programs Office to determine if it is allocating adequate 20 funding for each region of Oahu for homeless services; and 21 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for the purposes of this study, the regions of Oahu be delineated pursuant to the 2022 Point in 24 Time Count for Oahu; and 25 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human Services shall submit the results of its study, including any 28 findings and recommendations, to the Legislature no later than 29 twenty days before the convening of the Regular Session of 2024; 30 31 and 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 33 34 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human Services. 35 36 37 · OFFERED BY: _____ 38

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
