HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TAXATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS, TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY ON PROVIDING TAX BREAKS TO INDIVIDUALS WHO SELL PROPERTY TO NATIVE HAWAIIANS ON THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS WAITLIST.

1	WHEREAS, the availability of housing in the State,
2	especially for native Hawaiians, has been a long-standing
3	concern; and
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5	WHEREAS, in 2017 the United States Department of Housing
6	and Urban Development released the "Housing Needs of Native
7	Hawaiians" report that compares housing conditions of native
8	Hawaiians to those of other residents of the State; and
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10	WHEREAS, the report found that native Hawaiians are
11	disproportionately represented in the State's homeless
12	population; and
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14	WHEREAS, native Hawaiians continue to make up a large
15	percentage of that State's homeless population; and
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17	WHEREAS, in 2022, native Hawaiians made up forty-four
18	percent of the State's homeless population, with fifteen percent
19	of those homeless individuals reporting that they were on the
20	Department of Hawaiian Home Land's waitlist for a homestead
21	property;
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23	WHEREAS, there are approximately 28,700 native Hawaiian
24	applicants on the Department of Hawaiian Home Land's homestead
25	waitlist; and
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WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for more affordable 1 housing for native Hawaiians not only on homestead land, but 2 throughout the State; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the State needs innovative solutions to address 5 socio-economic problems faced by native Hawaiians and to put 6 7 native Hawaiians into affordable housing; now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 10 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 11 12 Taxation, in consultation with the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, is urged to conduct a feasibility study on providing tax 13 breaks to individuals who sell property to native Hawaiians who 14 are listed on the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands waitlist; 15 16 and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Taxation is 19 requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 20 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 21 the Regular Session of 2024; and 22 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to Director of Taxation and 25 Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission. 26 27 28 OFFERED BY: Cal 29

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
