## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONDUCT A SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT OF PROPOSED MANDATORY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR WEIGHT MANAGEMENT MEDICATION.

WHEREAS, the National Institutes of Health has reported 1 that obesity and being overweight are now the second leading 2 cause of death nationally, with an estimated three hundred 3 thousand deaths a year attributed to the epidemic; and 4 5 WHEREAS, obesity increases the risk for chronic diseases 6 and conditions, including high blood pressure, heart disease, 7 certain cancers, arthritis, mental illness, lipid disorders, 8 sleep apnea, and type 2 diabetes; and 9 10 WHEREAS, clinicians increasingly recognize that obesity is 11 closely linked to genetics and environmental factors; and 12 13 WHEREAS, more than half of Medicare beneficiaries are 14 treated for five or more chronic conditions per year; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the rate of obesity among Medicare beneficiaries 17 doubled from 1987 to 2002 and nearly doubled again by 2016, with 18 Medicare spending on individuals with obesity during that time 19 rising proportionately to reach \$50 billion in 2014; and 20 21 WHEREAS, on average, a Medicare beneficiary with obesity 22 costs \$2,018 more than a healthy-weight beneficiary; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 1020, introduced in the Regular 25 Session of 2023, proposes to expand existing health insurance 26 mandates to cover weight management medication for persons who 27 are obese or overweight with one or more related comorbidities; 28 now, therefore, 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 31 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 32



Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 1 Health is requested to conduct an impact assessment report of 2 mandating health insurance coverage for weight management 3 medication as proposed in Senate Bill No. 1020, introduced in 4 the Regular Session of 2023; and 5 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 7 further requested to include in its assessment the impact of 8 section 1311(d)(3) of the federal Patient Protection and 9 Affordable Care Act (PPACA) on Senate Bill No. 1020, or similar 10 legislation that includes but is not limited to the additional 11 cost of any benefits beyond the essential health benefits of 12 Hawaii's qualified health plans under the PPACA; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 15 also requested to determine how many qualified health plans are 16 available in Hawaii, including plans offered by health 17 maintenance organizations; the individual or group enrollment in 18 19 these plans; and the actuarial cost of the defrayment to the State for the reimbursement of weight management medication; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 22 requested to submit a report on its findings and 23 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 24 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 25 the Regular Session of 2024; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 29 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Department of Health and Insurance Commissioner, who is requested to transmit copies 30 to each insurer in the State that issues health insurance 31 32 policies. 33 34 35
