HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE AN EARLY LUNG CANCER SCREENING WORKING GROUP TO CONTINUE THE EFFORTS OF THE EARLY LUNG CANCER SCREENING TASK FORCE ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO ACT 162, SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII 2022.

1 WHEREAS, according to the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, lung cancer is the leading cause of 2 3 cancer deaths for men and women in the United States; and 4 5 WHEREAS, according to a recent report from the American Lung Association, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer 6 death for men and women in Hawaii; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, the American Lung Association's report also ranks Hawaii last in the nation for the early diagnosis of lung 10 cancer; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Act 162, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022 (Act 162), 13 established the Early Lung Cancer Screening Task Force within 14 the Department of Health to research the steps and resources 15 necessary to increase early lung cancer screening in Hawaii; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, the Department of Health submitted a January 2023 19 progress report to the Legislature indicating that the initial 20 meeting of the Early Lung Cancer Screening Task Force has been delayed due to changes in leadership in various state and county 21 departments; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the Early Lung Cancer Screening Task Force is 24 25 scheduled to sunset on July 31, 2023; and 26 WHEREAS, additional time is needed to ensure that the 27 28 activities required by Act 162 are carried out to address and

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1 reduce the impact lung cancer has on Hawaii's diverse 2 population; now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 5 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 6 Health is requested to convene an Early Lung Cancer Screening 7 Working Group to continue the efforts of the Early Lung Cancer 8 Screening Task Force established pursuant to Act 162, Session 9 Laws of Hawaii 2022, in researching the steps and resources 10 11 necessary to increase early lung cancer screening in Hawaii; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following individuals are 14 requested to serve as members of the Early Lung Cancer Screening 15 Working Group: 16 17 A representative from the Office of the Governor, to (1)18 be appointed by the Governor; 19 20 (2) A representative from the Senate, to be appointed by 21 the President of the Senate; 22 23 (3) A representative from the House of Representatives, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of 24 Representatives; 25 26 A representative from the Department of Health to be 27 (4) appointed by the Governor; 28 29 (5) 30 A representative from the Department of Human Services to be appointed by the Governor; 31 32 A representative from the University of Hawaii John A. 33 (6) Burns School of Medicine to be appointed by the 34 35 Governor; 36 37 (7)A representative from the University of Hawaii Cancer 38 Center to be appointed by the Governor; and 39 (8) A representative from each county to be appointed by 40 41 the respective Mayor of each county; and 42

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1 (1)Review all available research, studies, and models for 2 increasing early lung cancer screening rates in the 3 State; 4 5 (2) Conduct or initiate new studies as the Working Group 6 deems necessary; and 7 8 (3) Create a public awareness campaign to inform Hawaii 9 residents about early lung cancer screening; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Early Lung Cancer Screening Working Group is requested to submit an interim report of its 12 13 findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 14 to the Regular Session of 2024; and 15 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Early Lung Cancer Screening 18 Working Group is requested to submit a final report of its 19 findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than July 31, 2024; and 20 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Early Lung Cancer Screening 23 Working Group is requested to include in its report: 24 25 (1)An analysis of the costs associated with early lung 26 cancer screening; 27 28 (2)A list of qualified facilities in the State that 29 perform lung cancer screenings; 30 31 (3) Protocols for health care providers and health care 32 systems to identify populations at high risk for lung cancer; 33 34 (4) An explanation of how health care providers are made 35 36 aware of available insurance coverage for early lung cancer screenings; 37 38 (5) Copies of guidelines used by health insurance 39 40 providers to determine coverage for early lung cancer 41 screening; 42

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1 (6) A discussion of cultural and social barriers 2 associated with lung cancer screenings; 3 4 (7) Policy recommendations for increasing early lung 5 cancer screenings; and 6 7 (8) A work plan that identifies the steps needed in the next five years to increase lung cancer screenings in 8 9 the State; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Early Lung Cancer Screening Working Group be dissolved on July 31, 2024; and 12 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Secretary of 15 16 Veterans Affairs, Governor, Director of Health, Director of 17 Human Services, Dean of the John A. Burns School of Medicine at the University of Hawaii at Manoa, Director of the University of 18 Hawaii Cancer Center, mayors of the City and County of Honolulu 19 20 and the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai, Hospital Commander 21 of Tripler Army Medical Center, President and Chief Executive Officer of The Queen's Health Systems, President and Chief 22 23 Executive Officer of Hawaii Pacific Health, President of Kaiser 24 Foundation Health Plan and Hospitals of Hawaii, President of Hawaii Medical Service Association, Executive Director for the 25 26 American Lung Association in Hawaii, and Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii Primary Care Association. 27 28 29 30
