

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CENTERS FOR MEDICARE AND MEDICAID SERVICES TO INCREASE THE MONETARY COMPENSATION RECEIVED BY HEALTH CARE WORKERS WHOSE POSITIONS AND SERVICES ARE FUNDED UNDER THE MEDICARE PROGRAM.

1 WHEREAS, health care workers are essential to a functioning 2 society, but are too often overworked and underpaid; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic brought into 5 sharper focus the importance of health care workers and the dysfunction and collapse that can occur when there are not 6 7 enough health care workers to provide care to patients in a 8 timely manner; and 9 10 WHEREAS, although health care workers in America are viewed in a positive light, and even regarded as "health care heroes" 11 for tolerating difficult working conditions such as spending 12 long hours away from their families to cover understaffed 13 hospitals and health care facilities, many health care workers 14 have left their jobs prematurely due to exhaustion and 15 16 professional burnout; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the nationwide shortage of health care workers is 19 exacerbated by the United States' rapidly growing population of older adults; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, the United States Census Bureau has projected that by 2034, older adults will outnumber children for the first time 23 in the nation's history; more specifically, it is expected that 24 25 people age sixty-five and older will number seventy-seven 26 million, while children under age eighteen will number 76.5 million; further, it is estimated that by 2060, nearly one in 27 28 four Americans will be age sixty-five and older, the number of



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Americans age eighty-five and older will triple, and the number 1 of centenarians will reach a half-million; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, our aging population means that demand for health 5 care workers and the essential services they provide will also 6 grow, particularly with respect to in-home caregiving, assisted living facilities, skilled nursing, and hospice care; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services provides coverage for certain caregiving services under Medicare 10 11 Part A, which relates to hospital insurance, and Medicare Part B, which relates to medical insurance; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, an important way in which the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services could address the nation's health care 15 16 worker shortage before the situation dramatically worsens is by 17 ensuring that health care workers who are compensated through the Medicare program receive a higher level of compensation that 18 properly reflects their specialized skill set, expertise, and 19 20 essential role in society; now, therefore, 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 24 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Centers for 25 Medicare and Medicaid Services are requested to increase the 26 monetary compensation received by health care workers whose positions and services are funded under the Medicare program; 27 28 and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to each member of Hawaii's 31 congressional delegation, and to the Administrator of the 32 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. 33 34 35 36 OFFERED BY: JAN 19 2023
