

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF ELECTIONS TO PREPARE AND SUBMIT A PROPOSAL TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THE COST AND PERSONNEL REQUIRED TO PREPARE AND DISTRIBUTE A VOTER INFORMATION GUIDE.

1 WHEREAS, public confidence in the conduct of elections is essential to the operation of self-governance; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the public needs access to information on 5 candidates for elected office and ballot questions in a clear, standardized format; and 6 7 WHEREAS, there is increasing demand for access to 8 9 information in a digital format; and 10 WHEREAS, voters with special-needs require adaptive 11 technology to access digital information; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, voters may require ballot information to be made available in their native language; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives established the 17 Commission to Improve Standards of Conduct pursuant to House 18 Resolution No. 9, Regular Session of 2022, with the essential 19 goal of providing recommendations that would help restore public 20 trust in state government and increase the level of transparency 21 22 in its operations and accountability of individuals; and 23 WHEREAS, the Commission to Improve Standards of Conduct 24 convened regularly throughout 2022 to diligently review, 25 discuss, and consider the issues presented; submit an interim 26 report to the House of Representatives outlining areas of 27 immediate and long-term focus; receive input from the public and 28 invited individuals and agencies; and issue a final report with 29



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various recommendations and accompanying proposed legislation; 1 and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, one of the recommendations made by the Commission to Improve Standards of Conduct was to require the Office of 5 Elections to prepare a voter information guide that includes 6 candidate statements and statements on ballot questions; now, 7 8 therefore, 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 10 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 11 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Office of 12 Elections is requested to prepare a proposal detailing the cost 13 and personnel required to prepare and distribute a voter 14 information guide in a printed format, digital format, and 15 screen reader-accessible format for voters with special needs 16 17 who are unable to read standard print due to disability; and a translation of the digital voter information guide in Olelo 18 Hawaii, Chinese, Ilocano, and Tagalog, and any other language as 19 required by federal or state law on the Office of Elections' 20 website. The voter information guide would include: 21 22 A photograph and short statement of less than one 23 (1) 24 hundred fifty words for each candidate running for public office, to be prepared by the candidate; 25 provided that the Office of Elections may uniformly 26 limit the number of words for the candidate statement 27 28 by applicable public office; 29 30 (2) A clear and concise explanation drafted by the Department of the Attorney General of each state 31 constitutional amendment that will be proposed to 32 voters in the next general election; and 33 34 35 (3) A clear and concise explanation drafted by the appropriate county corporation counsel for each 36 proposed county charter amendment, proposed 37 initiative, and proposed referendum issue; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Elections is 40 41 ' requested to include in its cost estimate the cost to print and mail a physical copy of the voter information guide to any voter 42



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upon request, and to prepare and mail with each ballot for a primary election a notice to voters that a digital voter information guide is available on the Office of Elections' website and send the notice by electronic mail to all voters with special needs who have registered to receive alternate format ballots; and

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the information made available 9 over the Internet as part of the voter information guide would 10 need to meet or exceed the most current, ratified standards 11 under section 508 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 12 U.S.C. 794d), as amended, and the Web Content Accessibility 13 Guidelines 2.0 adopted by the World Wide Web Consortium for 14 accessibility; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Elections is 17 requested to submit the proposal to the Legislature no later 18 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 19 of 2024; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and Chief Election Officer.
