HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY ON IMPLEMENTATION OF A CIGARETTE LITTER PREVENTION PROGRAM IN HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, the Cigarette Litter Prevention Program, created by Keep America Beautiful in 2002, is the nation's largest 2 program aimed at eliminating cigarette litter; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, according to the 2020 Keep America Beautiful National Litter Study, nine out of 10 littered items counted 6 7 were four inches or less in length, with cigarette butts being 8 the most littered item in this category, accounting for 9,700,000,000 butts counted on any given day in the United 9 10 States; and 11 12 WHEREAS, communities that implement a Cigarette Litter Prevention Program consistently reduce cigarette litter by half, 13 14 based on local measurements taken in the first four to six months after the program is implemented; and 15 16 WHEREAS, since its inception, the Cigarette Litter 17 Prevention Program has been implemented in more than 1,800 18 communities across the United States; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, an effective local Cigarette Litter Prevention Program includes four proven, field-tested solutions or 22 strategies for reducing cigarette butt litter: 23 24 Reviewing local litter laws, including laws on litter 25 (1)caused by cigarette butts, and supporting enforcement 26 27 of these laws: 28

Raising awareness about the issue of proper cigarette 1 $(2)^{-1}$ butt disposal by using messaging and marketing 2 3 campaigns; 4 (3) Placing ash receptacles at transition points to non-5 smoking areas, such as beaches, hospitals, or public 6 7 parks; and 8 9 (4) Distributing pocket or portable ashtrays to adult smokers; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, the environment and natural beauty of Hawaii would benefit from less litter caused by cigarette butts; now, 13 therefore, 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 16 17 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Environmental 18 Health Administration of the Department of Health is urged to 19 conduct a feasibility study on implementation of a Cigarette 20 Litter Prevention Program in Hawaii; and 21 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Environmental Health 24 Administration of the Department of Health is requested to submit a report of its feasibility study, including any 25 findings, recommendations, or proposed legislation, to the 26 Legislature no later than twenty days before the convening of 27 the Regular Session of 2024; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 30 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health 31 and Deputy Director for Environmental Health Administration. 32 33 34 C.04 35 OFFERED BY:
