## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT OF PROPOSED MANDATORY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR VARIOUS SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH CARE SERVICES.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii has long been a leader in advancing reproductive rights and advocating for equitable and affordable 2 3 access to sexual and reproductive health care; and 4 5 WHEREAS, federal protections for abortion, preventive care, 6 contraceptives, and other sexual and reproductive health care services are consistently threatened, making state protections 7 for these services especially critical; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, numerous states have enacted laws that effectively eliminate abortion access in those states following the Supreme 11 Court of the United States' overturning of Roe v. Wade, which 12 had previously protected abortion access throughout the country; 13 14 and 15 16 WHEREAS, the Trump administration made it difficult for 17 insurers to cover abortion care and assembled a Supreme Court 18 whose actions resulted in restricted abortion access, and that 19 may strike down the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; 20 and 21 22 WHEREAS, eliminating the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act would force many Hawaii residents to pay more 23 24 out-of-pocket health care costs, leading many to delay or forego 25 needed care; and 26 WHEREAS, access to sexual and reproductive health care, 27 28 including no-cost preventive services, is critical for the health and economic security of all people in Hawaii and will 29 help avoid more costly treatments in the future; and 30



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WHEREAS, House Bill No. 1180, introduced during the Regular 1 Session of 2023, would prohibit discrimination in the provision 2 of sexual and reproductive health care services; and 3 4 WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires 5 that, before considering any legislative measure that mandates 6 health insurance coverage for specific health services, specific 7 diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part 8 9 of individual or group health insurance policies, the Legislature shall adopt a concurrent resolution asking the 10 11 Auditor to prepare and submit to the Legislature a report that assesses the social and financial effects of the proposed 12 13 mandatory coverage; now, therefore, 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 15 16 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 17 Session of 2023, that the Auditor is requested to conduct a 18 social and financial assessment of mandatory health insurance 19 coverage for various sexual and reproductive health care services as proposed by House Bill No. 1180 (Regular Session of 20 2023); and 21 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 24 submit a report of the Auditor's findings and recommendations, 25 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 26 of 2024; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 29 30 Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor, Director of Commerce 31 and Consumer Affairs, and Insurance Commissioner. 32 33 34 35
