HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO TAKE CERTAIN ACTIONS REGARDING FUGITIVE DUST.

WHEREAS, many acres of former agricultural land in the 1 State have become vacant for various reasons; and 2 3 WHEREAS, in windy conditions, large dust storms arise from 4 5 these lands; and 6 WHEREAS, the dust storms deposit precious topsoil into the 7 ocean, thereby damaging the reefs and the marine environment, as 8 well as detrimentally affecting the health of the residents 9 downwind; and 10 11 WHEREAS, although the Department of Health's Clean Air 12 Branch regulates the discharge of fugitive dust in the State and 13 imposes penalties for violations, existing rules do not require 14 land owners to have fugitive dust mitigation plans approved by 15 the Director of Health and the existing penalty structure does 16 17 not consider the scale of the dust emission; and 18 WHEREAS, there is a disincentive for owners of large areas 19 of vacant undeveloped land to take immediate action to control 20 fugitive dust discharge from their lands to preserve the 21 22 topsoil, prevent contamination of the marine environment, and protect the health and safety of the nearby communities; now, 23 therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 26 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 27 Session of 2023, that the Department of Health is requested to 28 amend its administrative rules, pursuant to Chapter 91, Hawaii 29 30 Revised Statutes, to: 31 32 Create an updated list of reasonable precautions that (1)33 a landowner may take to prevent visible fugitive dust from the land from becoming airborne, particularly 34 when the land is vacant and undeveloped; 35 36

(2)	Specify the best practical operations or treatments an owner of vacant undeveloped land may take or implement to prevent visible fugitive dust that originates from
	the land from being discharged beyond the land's lot line;
(3)	Require each owner of vacant, undeveloped land in the State to submit to the Department a fugitive dust mitigation plan for the owner's vacant undeveloped land, which shall be subject to approval by the Director of Health; and
(4)	Impose appropriate penalties for violations of rules relating to fugitive dust; and
	I FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is to monitor fugitive dust across the State; and
18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 20 requested to submit to the Legislature no later than twenty days 21 prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024, a report 22 of its progress and any recommendations, including any proposed 23 legislation; and 24
