HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT AN AUDIT OF THE HONOLULU POLICE DEPARTMENT; CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU DEPARTMENT OF CUSTOMER SERVICES, MOTOR VEHICLE, LICENSING, AND PERMITS DIVISION; AND DISTRICT COURT OF THE FIRST CIRCUIT.

WHEREAS, vehicle owners who sell or otherwise transfer 1 2 their vehicles to another person have reported erroneously receiving traffic citations even though they are no longer the 3 legal owner of the vehicle; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, when the transferor of a vehicle signs over the 7 vehicle's Certificate of Ownership to the transferee of the vehicle, the transferor is required by law to give notice of the 8 vehicle transfer to the Director of Finance; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the new owner (transferee) of the vehicle has the 11 responsibility of forwarding the Certificate of Ownership to the 12 13 appropriate county Director of Finance; and 14 15 WHEREAS, if the transferee fails to forward the Certificate 16 of Ownership to the appropriate county Director of Finance, the transferor remains on record as the registered owner of the 17 vehicle; and 18 19 WHEREAS, a situation may occur in which the transferee 20 commits a traffic infraction, resulting in a parking ticket; a 21 police officer issues a citation to the vehicle, and if the fine 22 23 is not paid by the citation's deadline, a default judgment is entered against the registered owner -- in this case, the 24 unwitting transferor; and 25 26 WHEREAS, although the transferor has filed a Notice of 27 28 Transfer with the appropriate county Director of Finance and Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), there are instances in which 29 30 the district court is not informed of the Notice of Transfer and issues a Notice of Default to the transferor; and 31 32 WHEREAS, when the transferor receives an erroneous Notice 33 34 of Default, the transferor must make multiple appearances in

Department of Customer Services, Motor Vehicle, Licensing, and 1 Permits Division; and District Court of the First Circuit; and 2 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 5 include; in the audit: 6 A list of Notice of Default Judgments that are issued 7 (1) 8 to persons who no longer owned the vehicle that was 9 the cause of the underlying traffic infraction that lead to the default judgment; provided that the person 10 who was issued the Notice of Default Judgment filed a 11 Notice of Transfer: 12 13 (2) For each default judgment, the amount of time between 14 the Notice of Default Judgment was issued and the 15 resolution of the default judgment; and 16 17 (3) For each default judgment, the reason each Notice of 18 19 Default Judgment was issued to the person who no 20 longer owned the vehicle and filed a Notice of Transfer; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 23 submit any findings and recommendations, including any proposed 24 legislation, to the Legislature not later than twenty days prior 25 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and 26 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 29 Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor, Chief of Police of the 30 Honolulu Police Department, Deputy Chief Judge of the District Court of the First Circuit, and Director of the Department of 31 Customer Service of the City and County of Honolulu. 32 33 34 35 h. / OFFERED BY:
