19	program, MICHAEL IDA is committed to uplifting the teaching
20	profession by supporting fellow teachers to be leaders and

23	leadership teams of the Hawai'i Council of Teachers of
24	Mathematics and Hawai'i Chapter of the Computer Science Teachers

of the Year for the Leeward District Nānākuli-Wai'anae Complex;

8 WHEREAS, NUIKALĀ KOERTE has been a dedicated early educator 9 for over two decades, eight of which she has served as a 10 kindergarten and first grade teacher at Wai'anae Elementary 11 School; she began her educational journey by earning a Bachelor 12 of Arts degree in Elementary Education from the University of 13 Hawai'i at Mānoa and Masters of Education degree with an emphasis 14 in Child Development from Chaminade University of Honolulu; and 15

16 WHEREAS, a proud Native Hawaiian educator, NUIKALĀ KOERTE 17 looks to indigenous knowledge to guide her teaching and educates 18 with a child-first focus; she cites the 'olelo no'eau, 'A'ohe pau 19 ka 'ike i ka hālau ho'okahi, as an invaluable cultural principle 20 that acknowledges that one can learn from many sources and 21 believes cultural traditions and methods that turn to nature and 22 community as resources can yield valuable lessons; and 23

24 WHEREAS, constantly caring for the social and emotional needs of her students, NUIKALĀ KOERTE created a student-friendly 25 website to help those feeling overwhelmed, anxious, or in need 26 27 of a brain break to nurture their personal development and is most proud of the hands-on learning experiences that she has 28 29 established with community partners Papahana Kuaola and Mālama Loko Ea, whose support provides her students with experiences in 30 'āina-based learning and working firsthand in lo'i kalo and loko 31 i'a; and 32

1 teacher at Wai'anae High School and transitioned to 'Ewa Makai Middle School in 2016; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, LEEANN MANUEL has been the induction and mentoring 5 lead at 'Ewa Makai Middle School for the past six years and currently serves as the curriculum coach for math, English 6 7 language arts, and social studies; and 8 9 WHEREAS, an exceptional educator, LEEANN MANUEL is committed to furthering educational resources within 'Ewa Makai 10 11 Middle School and has been an AVID program staff developer for the past nine years, aiming to close the achievement gap and 12 13 increase the college-going rate for students from low-income and minority families; she also utilizes Smarter Balanced 14 Assessments math and creates lessons and activities for Tools 15 for Teachers as a State Network of Educators Smarter Balance 16 17 teacher; and 18 19 WHEREAS, KEEVAN MATSUMOTO was recently named the 2023 Teacher of the Year for the Honolulu District Kaimuki-McKinley-20 21 Roosevelt Complex; and 22 23 WHEREAS, as a Konawaena graduate and second-generation 24 special education teacher, KEEVAN MATSUMOTO understands the value of a quality public school education and followed in the 25 footsteps of his mother, a Konawaena High School teacher for 34 26 years, specializing in students with moderate to profound 27 disabilities, who inspired him to pursue a career in education; 28 29 and 30 WHEREAS, KEEVAN MATSUMOTO received a Bachelor of Business 31 32 Administration degree in Finance and Human Resources Management from the University of Hawai'i College of Business 33 34 Administration, Masters of Human Resources Management degree 35 from the University of Hawai'i College of Business Administration, Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Special 36 Education from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa College of 37 38 Education, and Master's degree from the University of Hawai'i Shidler College of Business; he is also a National Board 39 40 Certified Teacher and the Founder and President of the non-





profit Kaimuki Youth Development Organization that provides 1 2 vocational and community engagement opportunities for children with disabilities; and 3 4 WHEREAS, currently the Special Education Student Services 5 Coordinator at Kaimukī High School, KEEVAN MATSUMOTO is 6 7 committed to the success and personal growth of his students, with a focus on supporting students beyond the classroom; he is 8 also the school's head of delegation and the head coach for the 9 Special Olympics team, for which he was awarded the Outstanding 10 School Delegation award by Special Olympics Hawai'i; and 11 12 WHEREAS, DAPHNE OKUNAGA was recently named the 2023 Teacher 13 14 of the Year for the Leeward District Pearl City-Waipahu Complex; and 15 16 WHEREAS, DAPHNE OKUNAGA began her remarkable educational 17 journey by earning a Bachelor of Arts degree, cum laude, in 18 Business Administration from Oregon State University, Master of 19 20 Business Administration degree, summa cum laude, from Hawai'i Pacific University, and Master of Education degree, summa cum 21 22 laude, from the University of Phoenix and is certified in secondary mathematics; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, DAPHNE OKUNAGA strives for excellence in all that 26 she pursues and has been a dedicated educator at her alma mater, Pearl City High School, for the past 18 years, serving in 27 28 numerous positions, such as a math and business teacher, 29 mathematics department chairperson, school community council 30 chairperson, International Business and Design Academy lead teacher, Introduction to College Mathematics state trainer, 31 32 graduation coordinator, class advisor, and assistant football 33 and soccer coach; and 34 35 WHEREAS, DAPHNE OKUNAGA has also served in numerous leadership positions, including as a former Hawai'i State Teacher 36 37 Fellow, Hawai'i representative for the Smarter Balanced 38 Performance and Practice Committee, and member of the Patsy T. 39 Mink Leadership Alliance; and 40
