BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 302L, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§30</u>	2L- Early learning board; qualifications;
5	administr	ation priorities. (a) Upon the nomination of any
6	voting me	mber to the board established pursuant to section
7	302L-1.6,	the governor shall provide written documentation
8	articulat	ing the administration's goals and priorities with
9	respect t	o the formation of a highly-functioning, well-balanced
10	board and	describing the nominee's qualifications.
11	<u>(b)</u>	Each nominee shall meet the following minimum
12	qualifica	tions:
13	(1)	Demonstrate integrity, civic virtue, and high ethical
14		standards and be willing to hold fellow board members
15		to the same;
16	(2)	Commit to being a conscientious and attentive board
17		member;

1	(3)	Have an understanding of best practices in early
2		learning governance or be willing to be trained in
3		best practices in early learning governance; and
4	(4)	Have a clear understanding of the board's role in
5		developing and protecting a clear, long-term strategic
6		vision for early learning.
7	<u>(c)</u>	Each nominee ideally shall meet the following
8	qualifica	tions:
9	(1)	Have substantial leadership experience that
10		illustrates the nominee's ability to function among
11		diverse colleagues as an effective team member, with
12		the ability to articulate, understand, and help shape
13		consensus on board policies; and
14	(2)	Demonstrate a deep and abiding interest in early
15		learning and a dedication to the social, academic, and
16		character development of children."
17	SECT	ION 2. Section 302L-1.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended b	y amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:
19	" (b)	The board shall consist of the following voting

7	governor	shall set the terms of the voting members initially
8	appointed	to the board as follows:
9	(1)	Three voting members shall serve one-year terms;
10	(2)	Three voting members shall serve two-year terms; and
11	(3)	Three voting members shall serve three-year terms;
12	provided	that the term of the voting members shall be three
13	years, ex	cept as provided for in the initial appointment in this
14	subsectio	on; provided further that voting members shall serve no
15	more than	three consecutive three-year terms; provided further
16	that the	voting members who are initially appointed to terms of
17	<u>two years</u>	or less pursuant to this subsection may be reappointed
18	to three	ensuing consecutive three-year terms. If a voting
19	member is	s nominated to a second or subsequent consecutive term,
20	the senat	e shall consider the question of whether to reconfirm
21	the votir	ng member at least one hundred twenty days prior to the



1	expiration of the voting member's immediately preceding term;
2	provided that if the senate has not taken final action to
3	reconfirm the voting member by the one hundred twenty-day
4	deadline, the voting member may continue to serve until the
5	senate takes final action on the reconfirmation.
6	Every voting member may serve beyond the expiration date of
7	the voting member's term of appointment until the voting
8	member's successor has been appointed by the governor and
9	confirmed by the senate."
10	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
13	provided that the amendments made to section 302L-1.6, Hawaii
14	Revised Statutes, shall not be repealed when that section is
15	reenacted on June 30, 2025, pursuant to Act 173, Session Laws of
16	Hawaii 2021, section 3, as amended by Act 109, Session Laws of
17	Hawaii 2022, section 14.
