A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 51, Session Laws 2 of Hawaii 2004, transferred the control of certain functions of executive branch agencies that pertained to education personnel 3 4 and facilities to the department of education to increase 5 operational efficiency while reducing bureaucracy. However, 6 after enactment of Act 51, the department of human resources development continued to provide most services to the employees 7 of the Hawaii state public library system. Eight years later, 8 9 Act 61, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, clarified that the transfer 10 of functions by Act 51 was not intended to include the Hawaii 11 state public library system or its employees.

12 The legislature further finds that despite the 13 clarification provided by Act 61, the aspects of workers' 14 compensation for Hawaii state public library system employees 15 continue to be within the functions of the department of 16 education, and not within the functions of the department of 17 human resources development. The legislature also finds that

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1 that the department of human resources development has not 2 received any additional staff or funding from the department of education to address its increased responsibilities to the 3 4 Hawaii state public library system and its employees as a 5 consequence of Act 61. 6 The purpose of this Act is to: 7 (1)Transfer the rights, powers, functions, duties, and 8 resources of the department of education relating to 9 workers' compensation for the Hawaii state public 10 library system and its employees to the department of 11 human resources development; 12 (2) Establish one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) position 13 within the department of human resources development 14 for the management and administration of workers' 15 compensation for the Hawaii state public library 16 system and its employees; and 17 (3) Appropriate funds for the workers' compensation costs 18 of the Hawaii state public library system and its 19 employees. 20 SECTION 2. All rights, powers, functions, duties, and 21 resources of the department of education relating to workers

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compensation for the Hawaii state public library system and its
employees are transferred to the department of human resources
development effective July 1, 2024, subject to repeal by
subsequent legislation.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 6 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 7 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 8 year 2024-2025 for the establishment of one full-time equivalent 9 10 (1.0 FTE) position within the department of human resources 11 development for the management and administration of workers' 12 compensation for the Hawaii state public library system and its 13 employees.

14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 15 of human resources development for the purposes of this Act. 16 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 17 or so 18 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 19 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 20 year 2024-2025 for the workers' compensation costs of the Hawaii 21 state public library system and its employees.

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1	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
2	of human resources development for the purposes of this Act.
3	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
