BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

5	and in several amounts hereinabove set forth or in lesser
6	amounts deemed appropriate, upon checks issued by the
7	comptroller; provided that departments shall obtain the approval
8	of the attorney general before payment of any claim may be made.
9	SECTION 4. Notwithstanding the sums hereinabove stated as
10	interest upon judgments against the State, payment of interest
11	shall be limited to the period from the date of the judgment, if
12	applicable, to thirty days after the effective date of this Act,
13	as provided in section 662-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for those
14	cases to which the statute applies.
15	SECTION 5. All unexpended and unencumbered balances of the
16	appropriations made in this Act as of the close of business on
17	June 30, 2024, shall lapse.
18	SECTION 6. If any provision of this Act, or the
19	application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
20	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
21	applications of the Act that can be given effect without the

1	invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
2	of this Act are severable.
3	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

PURPOSE: Provide for the authorization and payment of

claims against the State for refunds of taxes, for judgments and settlements, and for other miscellaneous payments as provided by chapters 37, 661, and 662, Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

MEANS: Authorize and appropriate funds for the

payment of such claims.

JUSTIFICATION: This bill serves as the vehicle by which

claims against the State are transmitted to the Legislature for its consideration. The Legislature will be asked to authorize and

fund the payment of such claims by an

appropriation of general and special funds. Timely passage of this bill will serve to minimize interest on those amounts for which

interest is accruing.

Impact on the public: _There would be no
direct impact on the public other than the

persons who claims are being paid.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Claims eligible for payment from a special fund will generally be charged to that special fund rather than the general fund.

Certain claims will be paid from a

department's appropriation as reflected in

the budget bill. In such case, that

department will be responsible for finding the moneys in its budget to pay for the judgments and settlements rendered against

it.
