A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE, ITS OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

12	only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure

SECTION 13. All unexpended and unencumbered balances of
the appropriations made in this Act as of the close of business
on June 30, 2024, shall lapse.

15 SECTION 14. If any provision of this Act, or the 16 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held 17 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or 18 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the 19 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions 20 of this Act are severable.

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1 SECTION 15. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
