A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that establishing a permanent educational support associate position placed within 2 the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and 3 4 human resources (CTAHR) is needed to successfully implement the following goals of the college's cooperative extension program: 5 6 Providing non-formal science-based education; (1) 7 Acting as the outreach component of the University of (2)8 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human 9 resources; and Extending practical applications of science to support 10 (3) local food systems, healthy living, youth development, 11 12 and the stewardship of natural resources for future 13 generations.

14 The legislature further finds that CTAHR's Kona cooperative 15 extension, which houses the Kona research station, provides 16 crucial support for local coffee farmers statewide, who 17 currently face dire threats to their crops from the recently

discovered coffee berry borer and from coffee leaf rust. With a
 farm-gate value of approximately \$48.4 million, and an unroasted
 value of \$101.5 million, the coffee industry represents the
 State's third highest valued agricultural commodity. Despite
 this, the coffee industry is currently served statewide by just
 one CTAHR extension agent.

7 The legislature further finds that CTAHR's sole extension 8 agent is currently supported by just one educational support associate position, which has historically been one hundred per 9 10 cent grant funded. Due to varying grant provisions, the 11 position is limited to work only within the scope of funded 12 projects and is unable to address the needs and challenges of 13 other industries supported by CTAHR's cooperative extension 14 program. Additionally, upwards of thirty to forty-seven per 15 cent of current grant funding is dedicated to salary and fringe 16 benefits for project support staff, which reduces funding for 17 educational events, applied research, travel for statewide 18 outreach, equipment, and materials and supplies that could 19 directly benefit local farmers and producers.

20 The legislature further finds that establishing a permanent 21 educational support associate position will provide much needed

1 support to extension faculty and enable the prioritization of 2 research and community outreach projects throughout the State, 3 and support the Kona research station, which encompasses eighteen acres of projects related to coffee, including coffee 4 5 leaf rust and coffee berry borer mitigation, as well as 6 macadamia, avocado, temperate fruit and nut germplasm, two-lined 7 spittlebug, tree pruning, grafting, and propagation, organic and conventional pesticides, and nematode management. 8

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish and 9 10 fund one full-time educational support associate position, within the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture 11 12 and human resources' coffee and orchard crops cooperative extension and applied research program, to provide 13 administrative, professional, and technical support to the 14 15 college's cooperative extension program, Kona research station, and Hawaii's highly valued agricultural industries that are 16 17 challenged with economically damaging pest, disease, and 18 production issues.

19 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$76,570 or so much
21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the

1 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2 2024-2025 for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent 3 educational support associate position within the University of 4 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources' Kona 5 cooperative extension to support the coffee and orchard crops 6 extension and applied research program and Kona research station 7 in the county of Hawai'i.

8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University9 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
