A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that accessing care is
often complicated for neighbor island residents. Most of the
State's specialty practices are located on O'ahu, since many
medical specialists are unwilling to practice in underserved
rural areas of the State. This inherent barrier to accessing
care underscores the severe need for comprehensive health care
coordination on the neighbor islands.

The legislature further finds that the department of 8 9 health's office of primary care and rural health, in partnership 10 with community organizations such as Community First, conducted a community health needs assessment for Hawai'i island titled 11 12 "Access to Care -- Health for Our Communities". The assessment analyzes 3,287 resident survey responses and identifies delays 13 14 in health care delivery as residents' greatest obstacle to care. 15 Nearly six in ten respondents report delays, often due to 16 limited availability of specialists practicing on O'ahu.



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The legislature further finds that larger societal concerns 1 2 such as affordable housing, the State's high cost of living, transportation difficulties, and child care challenges are 3 barriers to care disproportionately affecting residents of 4 5 underserved rural areas. To ensure health equity, the State must look beyond the symptoms of social determinants of health 6 7 to address the root causes of negative health outcomes 8 disproportionately affecting rural communities, low-income 9 communities, communities of color, and sexual and gender 10 minorities.

11 The legislature further finds that coordinated efforts at 12 all levels are necessary to examine social determinants 13 impacting a community's access to health care resources and 14 improve public health. The establishment of a strong health network in underserved areas would allow these areas to 15 16 efficiently develop a health care plan encompassing preventative and primary health care, specialty care, and urgent and 17 18 emergency care. On Hawai'i island, a comprehensive plan to align 19 health care priorities with existing resources will foster 20 collaboration between providers, avoid service duplication,

16	SECTION 2. (a) The office of primary care and rural	
17	health shall establish and administer a pilot program to

21	organizations to develop a 2030 one shared health vision plan	

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for Hawai'i county that aligns with appropriate providers' goals
and objectives.

3 The office of primary care and rural health shall. (b) 4 submit the 2030 one shared health vision plan required by 5 subsection (a), including any proposed long-term legislative grant-in-aid requests, to the legislature no later than twenty 6 7 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2024. 8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 9 or so 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 11 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 12 year 2024-2025 for the establishment of one permanent full-time 13 equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist IV position within the 14 department of health's family health services division to: Oversee the development of community plans; and 15 (1) 16 (2) Coordinate efforts across departments and nonprofit 17 community partners to address the social determinants 18 of health and health equity issues affecting 19 underserved rural areas statewide; provided that the funds shall support travel and activities 20

21 necessary for the development of the community plans.

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1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department

- 2 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.

Description:

Requires the Office of Primary Care and Rural Health to establish and administer a pilot program to collaboratively address the health and wellness needs of Hawai'i County's most underserved residents and develop a 2030 One Shared Health Vision Plan. Requires the Office of Primary Care and Rural Health to submit the plan to the Legislature prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024. Appropriates funds for the establishment of one permanent full-time equivalent program specialist IV position within the Department of Health's Family Health Services Division. (SD1)

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
