
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS TO
COLLABORATE WITH THE OFFICE OF VETERANS' SERVICES TO PLAN
AND CONSTRUCT MEMORIALS TO HONOR THE SACRIFICES AND
CONTRIBUTIONS OF VETERANS FROM HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, the freedom and security that United States
2 citizens enjoy today are direct results of the sacrifices and
3 continued vigilance of the United States armed forces over the
4 course of the nation's history; and

6 WHEREAS, public memorials are an important form of
7 recognition for veterans and military personnel who protect the
8 freedom and security of the United States; and

10 WHEREAS, it is both fitting and necessary for the State to
11 give tangible and visible recognition to the sacrifices and
12 contributions of veterans from Hawaii who served and protected
13 the nation's borders by land, sea, and air; and

15 WHEREAS, public memorials honoring the sacrifices and
16 contributions of veterans from Hawaii will preserve, perpetuate,
17 and share the legacy of Hawaii veterans who served to protect
18 the United States and develop deeper understandings of Hawaii
19 veterans' unique place in Hawaiian, American, and global
20 history; and

22 WHEREAS, public memorials are artistic pieces dedicated to
23 recognizing the sacrifice veterans have made while protecting
24 the freedom and security of the United States; and

26 WHEREAS, the mission of the Hawaii State Foundation on
27 Culture and the Arts is to promote, perpetuate, and preserve
28 culture and arts in Hawaii; now, therefore,

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second
2 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the
3 House of Representatives concurring, that the State Foundation
4 on Culture and the Arts is requested to collaborate with the
5 Office of Veterans' Services to plan and construct memorials to
6 honor the sacrifices and contributions of veterans from Hawaii;
