SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE FACILITATION OF A PATH TO CITIZENSHIP FOR IMMIGRANTS FROM PARTIES TO THE COMPACTS OF FREE ASSOCIATION.

WHEREAS, from 1946 to 1958 the United States conducted 1 sixty seven nuclear tests in the Marshall Islands, including 2 above-ground testing and detonation of a bomb with a magnitude 3 of over 1,000 times that of the Hiroshima bombing; and 4 5 WHEREAS, partially as compensation for the loss of life, 6 poor health conditions, displacement, and loss of land use due 7 to nuclear testing, the Compacts of Free Association (COFA) 8 between the United States, the Federated States of Micronesia 9 10 (Yap, Pohnpei, Chuuk, Kosrae), the Republic of Palau, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands were established starting in or 11 around 1986; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, the United States has a continuing military interest and presence in the region and COFA provides the United 15 States sole access to and substantial military and veto power 16 over areas of these island nations, which are considered of 17 great strategic value; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, COFA allows citizens of COFA nations to live and 21 legally work in the United States without visas as "nonimmigrants"; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, while citizens of COFA nations present in the United States are eligible to receive some social and health 25 services that other immigrants and United States citizens can 26 27 receive, they are ineligible for other services including Medicaid; and 28 29



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1 WHEREAS, under United States immigration law there is no path to United States citizenship for citizens of COFA nations; 2 now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 6 House of Representatives concurring, that the United States 7 Congress is encouraged to facilitate a path to citizenship for 8 immigrants from the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic 9 of Palau, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that United States Immigration and 12 Customs Enforcement is requested to refrain from deporting the 13 aforementioned immigrants; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 16 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader of 17 the United States Senate, Speaker of the United States House of 18 Representatives, members of Hawaii's congressional delegation, 19 and Director of United States Immigration and Customs 20 Enforcement. 21
